

# Newborn death: Rights panel seeks report from Health Dept, hospitals

Days after the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) sought a report from the Haryana Government over the death of a newborn allegedly due to the non-availability of ventilator support, the Haryana Human Rights Commission (HHRC) has also taken suo motu cognisance of the incident and issued notices to the state government and district authorities.

The newborn died on July 2 after the family allegedly ran from one hospital to another in Hisar and Rohtak in search of ventilator support.

The NHRC had issued a notice to the Chief Secretary on July 6, directing the state government to submit a detailed report within two weeks.

The HHRC Bench, comprising Chairperson Justice Lalit Batra, Judicial Member Kuldeep Jain and member Deep Bhatia, has directed the Additional Chief Secretary (Health) to submit a report on the existing policy governing emergency neonatal referrals and inter-hospital coordination, district-wise availability

of Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) and neonatal ventilators in government hospitals, and the measures taken after the incident to strengthen emergency neonatal care and prevent similar occurrences.

The Commission has also asked the Director General, Health Services, to furnish details of the total number of ventilators, including neonatal ventilators, in government hospitals, their functional status, equipment lying

unused, under repair or non-functional, including ventilators supplied during the Covid-19 pandemic, and whether any state-level audit of critical care equipment has been conducted during the past two years.

According to information placed before the Commission, Hisar Civil Hospital has only one neonatal ventilator in its NICU. Of nearly 40 other ventilators meant for the ICU, around 25 were reportedly lying unused in

storage, while about 13 had become non-functional due to technical defects.

The Commission has further directed the Director of Pt BD Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak, to explain the treatment provided to the newborn, the reasons for the non-availability of ventilator support, the occupancy status of NICU beds and ventilators at the relevant time, and whether any alternative arrangements or inter-hospital coordination

were attempted.

The Director of Maharaja Agrasen Medical College, Agroha, has also been asked to clarify whether the child was referred to the institution, the action taken, the availability and occupancy status of NICU beds and ventilators, and the reasons for the inability to provide ventilator support. However, according to available records, the child was not taken to Agroha and was referred directly to PGIMS, Rohtak.

The Civil Surgeon, Hisar, has been directed to submit the complete chronology of the newborn's treatment, referrals and movement from birth till death, along with medical records, details of neonatal ventilators available on the date of the incident, whether neighbouring government hospitals were contacted before successive referrals, and the action taken against officials concerned, if any.

The HHRC has also sought a status report from the District Medical Negligence Board, Hisar, which is probing the circumstances leading to the newborn's death.



# 2 men tied to pole, given shocks over theft suspicion in Raisen

## NHRC Takes Note After Torture Video Goes Viral



**Bhopal:** Two men were allegedly tied to a pole, beaten and given electric shocks by villagers on suspicion of stealing irrigation pump motors in Madhya Pradesh's Raisen district. The incident, captured on video, came to light after the footage went viral on social media on Saturday evening, prompting the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) to take cognisance.

The assault took place on July 4 in Karmodiya village under Raisen Kotwali police station limits. The victims, residents of Dhaniyakhedi village, were allegedly taken to a farm after being accused of stealing a water pump motor.

According to police, the villagers tied the two youths to a pole, assaulted them and allegedly subjected them to electric shocks in an attempt

to force a confession and extract the names of others purportedly involved in the theft. The shocks were allegedly administered using an electric fencing device installed around farms to keep wild animals away.

The incident remained undisclosed until the video surfaced online. The footage purportedly shows several men beating the victims while they were tied to a pole and administering electric shocks, sparking widespread outrage.

The NHRC took cognisance after its member, Priyank Kanoongo, shared the video on social media and said the commission had issued necessary directions.

Raisen SP Ashutosh Gupta said the villagers had apprehended the two suspects on July 4 on suspicion of stealing irrigation pump motors before taking them to

the police station. "Several stolen motors were recovered from their possession and legal action was taken in the theft case. However, allegations that the suspects were tortured and given electric shocks came to light only after the video surfaced on social media on Saturday," he said.

Gupta said police immediately registered a separate case after the video emerged and arrested two accused. The arrested men, identified as Jitendra Thakur and Bhanwarlal Thakur, have been booked under charges of assault and other relevant provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). They allegedly gave electric shocks to the duo. Efforts are underway to identify and arrest others seen in the video, he added.

Police said the investigation is continuing and more arrests are likely as additional suspects are identified from the viral footage.

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## दलित को बंधक बना यातना देने का आरोप

**जासं, भुवनेश्वर :** गंजाम जिले के बरहमपुर सदर थाना क्षेत्र से एक युवक की बरेहमी से पिटाई का कथित वीडियो वायरल होने के बाद हड़कंप मच गया है।

वायरल वीडियो और इंटरनेट मीडिया पर प्रसारित शिकायत पत्र में दावा किया गया है कि एक दलित युवक को करीब तीन दिनों तक बंद कमरे में बंधक बनाकर रखा गया और उसके साथ मारपीट की गई। वायरल वीडियो में एक युवक को कमरे के अंदर पीटते हुए देखा जा सकता है।

वीडियो में कुछ अन्य लोग भी मौजूद दिखाई दे रहे हैं। हालांकि, दैनिक जागरण वायरल वीडियो की सत्यता की स्वतंत्र रूप से पुष्टि नहीं करता है।

वायरल वीडियो लोगों की जुबान पर है। इंटरनेट मीडिया पर वायरल शिकायत पत्र में पीड़ित युवक ने आरोप लगाया है कि उस पर कुछ लोगों द्वारा अवैध गतिविधियों में शामिल होने का दबाव बनाया जा रहा था। विरोध करने पर उसे जबरन एक कमरे में बंद कर दिया गया। युवक का दावा है कि उसे लगभग तीन दिनों तक बंधक बनाकर रखा गया और इस दौरान उसके साथ मारपीट की गई। इतना ही नहीं, उसे भोजन और पानी तक नहीं दिया गया। युवक ने अपनी जान को खतरा बताते हुए राष्ट्रपति, प्रधानमंत्री, राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग (एनएचआरसी), ओडिशा के पुलिस महानिदेशक (डीजीपी) तथा गंजाम जिला प्रशासन को लिखित शिकायत

भेजकर न्याय की गुहार लगाई है। शिकायत में आरोपितों के नाम भी दर्ज होने का दावा किया गया है। घटना से संबंधित वीडियो और शिकायत पत्र सामने आने के बाद स्थानीय स्तर पर मामले को लेकर चर्चा तेज हो गई है। लोगों ने पूरे मामले की निष्पक्ष जांच कर दोषियों के खिलाफ कड़ी कार्रवाई की मांग की है। सामाजिक संगठनों ने भी मामले की निष्पक्ष जांच कराने और यदि आरोप सही पाए जाते हैं तो दोषियों के खिलाफ सख्त कानूनी कार्रवाई करने की मांग उठाई है। फिलहाल बरहमपुर सदर थाना पुलिस की ओर से वीडियो की प्रामाणिकता अथवा शिकायत में लगाए गए आरोपों की आधिकारिक पुष्टि नहीं की गई है।

## वैटिलेटर न मिलने पर नवजात की मौत का मामला

# हरियाणा मानवाधिकार आयोग ने संबंधित अफसरों से स्पष्टीकरण मांगा

हिसार, 12 जुलाई (स्वामी): राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग के बाद अब हरियाणा मानवाधिकार आयोग ने सिविल अस्पताल और रोहतक पी.जी.आई. में वैटिलेटर न मिलने से नवजात की मौत के मामले में सत रुख अपनाया है। आयोग ने अतिरिक्त मुख्य सचिव, स्वास्थ्य एवं परिवार कल्याण विभाग महानिदेशक, स्वास्थ्य सेवाएं निदेशक, रोहतक पी.जी.आई. निदेशक, महाराजा अग्रसेन मैडिकल कॉलेज प्रबंधन और सिविल सर्जन हिसार को पत्र भेजकर स्पष्टीकरण मांगा है। पत्र में लिखा है कि नवजात की मौत मामले में आखिरकार कौन जिम्मेवार है और उसके खिलाफ क्या कार्रवाई की गई है। इसके अलावा प्रदेश के सरकारी अस्पतालों में वैटिलेटर की क्या स्थिति है।

लिखा है कि स्वास्थ्य विभाग प्रदेश के सरकारी अस्पतालों में उपलब्ध कुल वैटिलेटर (जिनमें नवजात शिशुओं के लिए वैटिलेटर और नीकू शामिल हैं), उनकी वर्तमान कार्यशील स्थिति और उनके इस्तेमाल की जानकारी दें। इस्तेमाल न हो रहे, मर मत के लिए रखे गए या काम न कर रहे वैटिलेटर की संख्या (इसमें कोविड-19 महामारी के दौरान सप्लाई किए गए वैटिलेटर भी शामिल हैं) की

स्थिति बताई जाए। पिछले दो साल में वैटिलेटर और क्रिटिकल केयर उपकरणों का राज्य स्तरीय ऑडिट किया गया है और क्या सुधारात्मक कदम उठाए गए हैं। मामला उजागर होने के बाद क्या कार्रवाई की गई है।

### यह है सारा मामला

महावीर कॉलोनी की ज्ञानती ने 2 जुलाई को बताया था कि उसके भाई राकेश की पत्नी पूजा को प्रसव-पीड़ा के चलते कल सिविल अस्पताल में लेकर आए थे। महिला चिकित्सक ने कई प्रकार की जांच करवाकर उसे अस्पताल में भर्ती किया। पूजा ने आज 11.30 बजे ऑपरेशन से एक बेटे को जन्म दिया। जन्म के बाद नवजात को सांस लेने में परेशानी हो रही थी। उसे नीकू में ले जाया गया। वहां करीब डेढ़ घंटे तक उसे रखा। उसके बाद कहा कि वैटिलेटर न होने के कारण इसे रोहतक रेफर कर रहे हैं। फिर एंबुलेंस में रोहतक पी.जी.आई. गए। वहां पहुंचने पर चिकित्सकों ने कहा कि वैटिलेटर की व्यवस्था हो जाएगी। रातभर नवजात को बिना वैटिलेटर रखा। स्टाफ ने सुबह कहा कि वैटिलेटर की अभी कोई व्यवस्था नहीं है आप बच्चा ले जाओ। बाद में हिसार के एक निजी अस्पताल में उपचार के दौरान बच्चे की मौत हो गई थी।

## मानवाधिकार आयोग पहुंचा बार के बाहर हत्या का मामला

जमशेदपुर। बिष्टुपुर में डीडी बार के बाहर पुलिस की मौजूदगी में दो युवकों पर जानलेवा हमले और बाद में एक युवक हिमांशु की मौत का मामला राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग (एनएचआरसी) तक पहुंच गया है। आयोग ने मामले में दायर शिकायत स्वीकार करते हुए डायरी नम्बर जारी कर दी है। शिकायत दर्ज होने के बाद आगे की प्रक्रिया शुरू होगी।

यह शिकायत झारखंड मानवाधिकार सम्मेलन (जेएचआरसी) के प्रमुख मनोज मिश्रा ने राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग को भेजी थी। शिकायत में आरोप लगाया गया कि बिष्टुपुर क्षेत्र में पुलिस वैन की मौजूदगी के दौरान दो युवकों को बाहर निकालकर उनपर जानलेवा हमला किया गया। घटना में गंभीर रूप से घायल हिमांशु की इलाज के दौरान मौत हो गई, जबकि दूसरा युवक प्रत्युष अब भी अस्पताल में इलाज रत है।

**JAMSHEDPUR (12 July) :** जमशेदपुर के बिष्टुपुर थाना क्षेत्र में पुलिस की मौजूदगी में दो युवकों पर हुए जानलेवा हमले का मामला अब राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग (एनएचआरसी) तक पहुंच गया है। आयोग ने इस मामले में दायर की गई कंप्लेंट को एक्सेप्ट करते हुए डायरी नंबर 15568/IN/2026 जारी कर दिया है। दरअसल, झारखंड मानवाधिकार सम्मेलन (जेएचआरसी) के प्रमुख मनोज मिश्रा ने एनएचआरसी को यह कंप्लेंट भेजी थी। कंप्लेंट में आरोप है कि बिष्टुपुर में पुलिस वैन से दो युवकों को खींचकर क्रिमिनल्स ने उन पर जानलेवा हमला कर दिया। इस घटना में गंभीर रूप से घायल हुए हिमांशु ने दो दिन बाद हॉस्पिटल में दम तोड़ दिया, जबकि दूसरा युवक प्रत्युश अभी भी जिंदगी और मौत की जंग लड़ रहा है।



## **आर्टिकल 21 का वॉयलेशन और कार्रवाई की डिमांड**

कंप्लेंट में मृतक हिमांशु की फैमिली को एक करोड़ रुपये का कंपनसेशन और परिवार के एक मेंबर को सरकारी नौकरी देने की डिमांड की गई है। इसके अलावा घायल प्रत्युश के सही ट्रीटमेंट और सेफ्टी की गारंटी भी मांगी गई है। एनएचआरसी द्वारा कंप्लेंट एक्सेप्ट कर डायरी नंबर जारी करने को एक बड़ी प्रोग्रेस माना जा रहा है। अब इस मामले में सबकी नजरें एनएचआरसी के अगले स्टेप पर टिकी हैं। अगर आयोग राज्य सरकार और पुलिस एडमिनिस्ट्रेशन से डिटेल रिपोर्ट मांगता है, तो यह स्टेट के लॉ एंड ऑर्डर और पुलिस की जिम्मेदारी पर एक बड़ा सवाल खड़ा करेगा। वहीं, पीड़ित परिवार और ह्यूमन राइट्स से जुड़े लोगों को इस मामले में फेयर इन्वेस्टिगेशन और दोषियों पर कड़ी कार्रवाई की पूरी उम्मीद है।

The Haryana Human Rights Commission (HHRC) has ordered a review of the state's neonatal emergency care system on Tuesday, following the reported death of a newborn in Hisar on July 1 due to a lack of ventilator support for nearly 24 hours despite the infant being taken to three hospitals across Hisar and Rohtak districts. The HHRC's July 7, order, came a day after the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) took suo-moto cognisance of the matter on July 6.

The commission has sought detailed reports from six authorities, including the additional chief secretary (health), director general health services (DGHS), civil surgeon, Hisar, directors of PGIMS Rohtak and Maharaja Agrasen Medical College (MAMC), Agroha, and the District Medical Negligence Board, Hisar. The order mentioned that the reports should be filed before the next hearing on September 1.

Calling the allegations a matter of "Grave public importance", the commission observed that the incident points to possible systemic failures in Haryana's public healthcare system, including inadequate critical care infrastructure, poor inter-hospital coordination and deficiencies in emergency referral management.

The action follows media reports that a baby born at Hisar civil hospital developed severe respiratory distress shortly after birth and required immediate ventilator support. Since the hospital's only neonatal ventilator was reportedly occupied, the infant was referred first to MAMC Agroha and then to PGIMS Rohtak, where ventilators were also reportedly unavailable. The family eventually shifted the baby to a private hospital in Hisar, where the newborn was declared dead on arrival after nearly 24 hours spent travelling between hospitals.

HHRC noted that a preliminary inquiry by the health department had reportedly pointed to a communication gap in locating an available ventilator. If established, it said, such findings would reveal serious deficiencies in emergency response, referral management and coordination among government hospitals.

The order also mentions reports revealing that the civil hospital, Hisar, allegedly had only one neonatal ventilator, which was already occupied, while a proposal to install another ventilator had not yet been sanctioned. It further referred to reports claiming that although nearly 40 ventilators were available in the hospital, about 25 were lying unused in storage and another 13 had become non-functional due to technical faults. Several ventilators supplied during the Covid-19 pandemic were also reported to be either unused or awaiting repairs.

Questioning the referral process, the commission stressed that referral decisions for critically ill patients must be based on confirmed availability of ICU beds, NICU beds and ventilators rather than assumptions.

Among the key directions, the additional chief secretary (health) has been asked to submit the state's emergency neonatal referral policy, district-wise details of NICUs and neonatal ventilators, measures taken after the incident and whether Haryana has any real-time system to monitor ICU, NICU and ventilator availability across government hospitals. If such a mechanism does not exist, the government has been asked to provide a timeline for implementing one, reads the order.

On July 6, NHRC had taken suo moto cognisance of the incident and issued a notice to the Haryana chief secretary, seeking a detailed report on the incident within two weeks.

Caught on Theft Suspicion, Tied to Pole, Electrocuted: Two Youths Tortured in MP Village; NHRC Intervenes

In Madhya Pradesh, villagers tortured two youths for allegedly stealing a water pump motor. They tied them to a pole and gave them electric shocks.

A shocking incident unfolded in Madhya Pradesh's Raisen district after two youths were allegedly tortured and beaten by a mob on suspicion of theft earlier this month. A video of the incident has gone viral, showing two youths tied to a pole, beaten and given electric shocks by the villagers over suspicion of theft.

As per the report, this incident took place on July 4 in the Karmodiya village under Raisen Kotwali police station limits. As per the Times of India report, the victims reportedly hailed from the Bairagi community in Dhaniyakhedi village. These two were accused of stealing a water pump motor and were thereafter taken to a farm where they were tortured.

**Villagers Attempt to Force a Confession: Police**

The villagers tied the youths to a pole and assaulted them in an attempt to force a confession out of them. According to the police, the villagers also did this to make them reveal the names of others involved in the alleged theft.

The video surfaced online on Saturday evening when the National Human Rights Commission took cognisance of the incident. The NHRC has taken the video under consideration after its member, Priyank Kanoongo, shared it on its official X handle with a caption that reads, "We are taking cognizance and issuing necessary instructions."

In the video, the two youths could be seen tied to a pole while being surrounded by a mob of people who were beating them and administering electric shocks to the victims. The electric shocks were given with a device installed around to protect crops from wild animals.

**Stolen Motors Recovered**

The villagers caught the youths on suspicion of theft of irrigation pump motors and took them to the police station, said Raisen Superintendent of Police (SP) Ashutosh Gupta, according to the report.

Beaten to force confession, NHRC takes cognisance

The youths were allegedly tied to a pole in the farm and assaulted by the villagers in an attempt to force a confession out of them and to make them reveal the names of others who were allegedly involved in the alleged theft, ToI reported citing police.

After the video of the assault surfaced on social media on Saturday evening, the National Human Rights Commission took cognisance of the incident.

The footage of the incident showed the victims tied to a pole while being surrounded by a mob of people, who were beating them. The men were also administering electric shocks to the victims. The two were reportedly given electric shocks using a device installed around the farms to protect crops from wild animals.

The video was taken note of by the NHRC after its member, Priyank Kanooongo, shared it on his official X handle. "We are taking cognizance and issuing necessary instructions," he said.

Thirty-one years after his abduction and custodial death in 1995, Punjab's human rights crusader Jaswant Singh Khalra is back in public discourse, after his biopic Satluj was removed from an OTT platform and banned in India within 48 hours of its release on July 3. On Saturday, the movie was also pulled off internationally from the platform.

Known as Laawaris laashan da waaris (guardian of unclaimed bodies), Khalra, 42, had rattled the Punjab Police and the then Congress government with his work on Punjab's 'disappearing' men. Khalra was documenting the alleged illegal cremations of thousands of bodies during Punjab's militancy years, after the police had branded them "unclaimed or unidentified".

His disappearance in 1995 prompted a Supreme Court-ordered CBI probe into both his abduction and the alleged illegal cremations. In 2011, the Supreme Court upheld life imprisonment for five Punjab policemen, including a DSP, for Khalra's murder.

Here's a look at how the Khalra custodial murder case and the Punjab extra judicial killings case have been legally documented, from the CBI to the Supreme Court.

How Khalra's case reached Supreme Court: Telegram by SGPC chief, wife's petition

Soon after Khalra was abducted from his house in Kabir Park of Amritsar city on September 6, 1995, Gurcharan Singh Tohra, the then president of Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) and a senior leader of the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD), sent a telegram to Justice Kuldeep Singh, which he acknowledged receiving on September 7, 1995.

The telegram stated that Khalra, who was then the general secretary, Human Rights Wing, of SAD, was "kidnapped by the police." Treating the telegram as a habeas corpus petition, the Supreme Court issued notice to the Punjab home secretary, the director general of police (DGP), and SSP Amritsar.

Meanwhile, Khalra's wife Paramjit Kaur Khalra also filed a habeas corpus plea in the Supreme Court, under Article 32 of the Constitution. According to the petition, Paramjit also stated that her husband was investigating "unclaimed dead bodies" and police excesses, and used to encourage families of victims to file writs in courts. She further stated she "strongly believes that her husband was picked up at the instance of Ajit Singh Sandhu, then SSP Tarn Taran, who had "several such allegations pending against him."

How Khalra's case reached Supreme Court: Telegram by SGPC chief, wife's petition

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The Amritsar Police in its affidavit in the court said that "Khalra was neither arrested nor wanted by us in any criminal case." SSP Sandhu claimed in the court on September 23, 1995 that he "never threatened Khalra", and

“never forced him to withdraw writ petitions filed against police excesses, custodial deaths etc.” The SSP also claimed he was on leave from September 5 to 11 for his daughter’s wedding in Chandigarh.

Khalra’s press note on mass illegal cremations

Thus, Paramjit Kaur Khalra did not seek a probe only into her husband’s disappearance, she also placed before the court Khalra’s investigation of the alleged fake encounters and illegal cremations by Punjab Police.

What became the basis for a CBI investigation was a press note issued by Khalra and his associate, Jaspal Singh Dhillon, on January 16, 1995.

Placed before the Supreme Court, the press note revealed: “The investigation team decided to work in Amritsar and its neighboring police districts. It was learnt that police regularly brings bodies to municipality cremation grounds for cremation, declaring them as unclaimed... The only record available is through firewood receipts which were issued to dispose these bodies.”

The note added, “In Amritsar district, maximum unclaimed bodies were brought for cremation near Durgiana Mandir. From June 1, 1984 to the end of 1994, about 2000 bodies have been cremated as unclaimed. During the first year of the government of (then Punjab chief minister) Beant Singh and 300 bodies were brought to Durgiana Mandir cremation ground. While 41 died of bullet injuries or police encounters, no reason was recorded for rest of 259 persons. No postmortem conducted on 276 bodies.”

While Jaswant Singh Khalra and his wife always maintained that “at least 25,000 such disappearances of youths happened across Punjab during the militancy period”, as shown in the film, the “press note” submitted in the Supreme Court was focused on 2,097 such bodies in Amritsar district alone.

Landmark SC order

Clubbing Tohra’s telegram and Paramjit’s petition, the Supreme Court Bench of Justice Kuldeep Singh and Justice S Saghir Ahmad, in a landmark order on November 15, 1995, appointed the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to investigate both Khalra’s disappearance and the alleged extra-judicial killings in Punjab.

Excerpts from the order state: “Court cannot close its eyes to the contents of the press note...even if partially true it would be a gory tale of human rights violations.”

CBI files report

On July 22, 1996, the Supreme Court acknowledged the CBI’s 74-page findings, which said that “prima facie, it has been found that a total of 984 bodies were cremated as “lavaris” by the police in Tarn Taran police district.” The CBI said in the court that probe was still ongoing.

‘Worst crime against humanity’

Meanwhile, the CBI on July 30, 1996, informed the apex court that it had decided to prosecute nine policemen, Ajit Singh Sandhu, SSP Tarn Taran; Ashok Kumar, DSP, Bhikhiwind; Jaspal Singh, DSP, Tarn Taran; Sub-inspector/SHO Satnam Singh (Jhabal police station), S-I Surinderpal Singh (Sirhali police station), SI Jasbir Singh (Manochacha police station), SI Rachpal Singh (Kang PS), ASI Amarjit Singh and head constable Pirthipal Singh, for Khalra’s abduction.

However, Khalra’s whereabouts remained unknown even a year after he was picked up.

In another landmark order on August 7, 1996, the Supreme Court said that Paramjit Kaur Khalra was undergoing the “worst crime against humanity.”

“... She has been running from pillar to post...Kidnapping of a person whose family is totally in dark about his whereabouts – even about the fact where he is dead or alive – is the worst crime against humanity,” said the court,

while directing the Punjab government to pay interim relief of Rs 10 lakh to the family.

CBI submits final report, NHRC roped in

After the CBI submitted its final report into the alleged illegal mass cremations of 2,097 bodies in Amritsar district, the Supreme Court on December 12, 1996 said: "The report is self explanatory and speaks for itself... Report indicates that 585 bodies were fully identified, 274 partially identified and 1238 unidentified. The report discloses flagrant violation of human rights on a mass scale."

The SC ordered that the report be sent to the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in a "sealed cover", while directing the CBI to "continue the probe and register cases", and present the "status report" in the court "every three months." It directed the NHRC to see that family/heirs of the 585 identified people get adequate compensation under the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993.

Khalra's murder confirmed only after 3 years

On March 2, 1998, Kuldip Singh Bachra, then special police officer attached with SHO Satnam Singh, told the CBI that Khalra was "murdered secretly and his body thrown into the canal near Harike (the river Sutlej) at midnight just after Diwali" in 1995. His body was never recovered. Bachra also said Khalra had been tortured in custody.

He also said he could not reveal these details earlier out of fear of then SSP Ajit Singh Sandhu, who allegedly died by suicide during the trial in 1997. Later, the CBI confirmed the date of Khalra's murder as October 27, 1995.

While the CBI's trial court in Patiala convicted six policemen on November 18, 2005, the punishment of five of them was enhanced to life imprisonment by the Punjab and Haryana High Court on October 16, 2007 and one was acquitted. The Supreme Court on November 4, 2011 upheld the life imprisonment of five policemen for Khalra's murder: DSP Jaspal Singh, SIs Satnam Singh, Jasbir Singh, Surinderpal Singh and HC Pirthipal Singh.

The Supreme Court in its final verdict on November 4, 2011, had concluded: "Police atrocities in India had always been a subject matter of controversy and debate... CBI probe revealed that 984 dead bodies were cremated as "lawaris" in Tarn Taran alone and a large number of innocent persons had been killed by police for which there was sufficient material to register cases against the police officials..."

The trials in several fake encounter cases are still ongoing, and over a 100 Punjab Police personnel have been convicted so far.

The SC further said: "Jaswant Singh Khalra had taken the task to expose the misdeeds of the police... killing innocent people under the pretext of being terrorists and cremating them without any identification.. Police authorities did not like such activities.. and tried to desist him. He was able to generate public pressure against police authorities. Ajit Singh Sandhu, SSP, hatched a conspiracy with other police personnel to eliminate him... Dead body could not be recovered... Police atrocities are always violative of the constitutional mandate... Tolerance of police atrocities would amount to acceptance of systematic subversion and erosion of rule of law..."

### Powerloom Operator Dies of Electrocution, Family Alleges Negligence

Two Youths Tied To Pole, Given Electric Shocks Over Motor Theft Suspicion In Raisen; 2 Arrested After NHRC Takes Cognisance -- VIDEO

A video showing two youths being allegedly subjected to electric shocks over suspected motor theft in Raisen, Madhya Pradesh, has triggered outrage. The victims were reportedly tied to a pole, beaten and tortured in Karmodiya village. Police registered an FIR, arrested two suspects, and are verifying others involved. The NHRC has taken cognisance of the incident.

Raisen (Madhya Pradesh): A shocking video showing two youths being subjected to electric shocks surfaced on social media on Sunday from Madhya Pradesh's Raisen, prompting even the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) to swing into action.

According to information, the victims were subjected to inhuman treatment over suspicion of motor theft. The incident took place in Karmodiya village under the Raisen Kotwali police station limits. The victims are reportedly residents of Dhaniyakhedi village and belong to the Bairagi community.

The video is being widely circulated on social media and is being termed as "inhuman punishment". Netizens also said that India does not allow such treatment even to prisoners.

Disturbing visuals surface

In the video, the victims can be seen tied to a pole in a field. They are being beaten and given electric shocks using a device meant to protect crops from wild animals, allegedly to force them to confess to the theft.

The incident came to light after the video of the alleged assault went viral on social media on Saturday evening.

Two arrested

Following the video, police started an investigation and registered an FIR. Two suspects have been arrested, while efforts are on to identify and nab others involved.

SDPO Pratibha Sharma said, "A viral video has come to the notice of the police today, in which two individuals, who are being called thieves, are being beaten up and abused by a group of people. Initial action in this matter was taken by the Kotwali police, in which an FIR was registered against both the suspects around July 4. Both of them were found stealing motorcycles and scooters, on the basis of which a case was registered at the Kotwali police station."

Locals said the two youths were taken to a field after being suspected of stealing a water motor.

They were allegedly tied to a pole and assaulted. The suspects reportedly tried to force them to reveal the names of others allegedly involved in the theft.

The matter gained attention after a video surfaced online showing some people allegedly beating a youth tied to a pole and giving him electric shocks. After the video went viral, police immediately launched an investigation.

NHRC takes cognisance

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has also taken note of the incident. NHRC member Priyank Kanoongo shared the video on social media and said that the commission had taken cognisance of the matter and issued necessary directions.

Police have registered a case against Jitendra Thakur and Bhanwarlal Thakur under relevant sections related to assault and other offences.

Both suspects have been arrested, while the identities of other people seen in the video are being verified and further investigation is underway.

Viral video: Youth beaten up, tortured brutally in Ganjam; 4 booked

Ganjam, July 12: A video showing a young man being brutally beaten and assaulted inside a room in Berhampur of Ganjam district has gone viral on social media triggering outrage, leading to police action, with Sadar Police reportedly registering FIR against four persons.

The victim is identified as Prasanta Das of Krupasindupur of Berhampur. He was allegedly confined illegally in a locked room for nearly three days, during which he was physically assaulted and subjected to severe torture.

In the footage, four persons were seen inside the room while one of them was mercilessly beating the youth.

Meanwhile, the victim's parents and wife alleged that Prasanta was forced by a group of persons to drive a vehicle transporting illegal ganja. They claimed that when Prasanta refused to do so, he was abducted, illegally confined for nearly three days, physically assaulted, and denied food and water throughout his captivity.

A written complaint purportedly filed by the victim youth has also surfaced online, naming several individuals as the alleged attackers.

Claiming that his life remained under threat, the youth said he had submitted written representations to the President, the Prime Minister, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), the Director General of Police, and the Ganjam district administration, seeking protection and a proper and fair investigation into the incident.

History-sheeter held for assaulting youth in Berhampur

Berhampur: Police on Sunday arrested a 23-year-old history-sheeter for allegedly assaulting a youth after confining him to a locked room, some months ago.

The prime accused was identified as R Sibaram alias R Arup of Pratap Krushna Chandra Pur under Berhampur Sadar police station limits, said police. They took swift action against the accused when the youth's assault went viral on social media. The accused was a history-sheeter and was involved in at least three criminal cases in the past.

The victim, identified as Prasant Das, a driver and a resident of Krupasindhu Pur under Berhampur Sadar police station limits, lodged a complaint against the accused in this regard on Sunday. He also complained to the President, Prime Minister, commissioner, NHRC, chief minister's grievance cell, director-general of police and several others, earlier.

In his complaint, Das said he was the only son of his visually impaired parents and was living in fear. He lodged a delayed complaint due to the fear, as the accused threatened to kill him if he disclosed the matter.

"The incident has raised grave concerns over the law and order situation in the region. We have registered a case against the accused in Berhampur Sadar police station under different sections of the BNS and Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe (Prevention and Atrocities) Act and arrested one of the accused," said additional SP (Berhampur) Alok Jena. The pen-drive containing the footage of the incident was seized, he said.

Preliminary investigation has revealed that the accused and the victim were well-known to each other. The victim refused to do some illegal work, which the accused allegedly directed, police said. Peeved, the accused confined him to a room, assaulted him with a fibre rod with an intention to kill him. He also threatened to kill if he disclosed the incident, police added.

The ASP said investigation was underway and other people involved in the incident would be arrested soon.

Viral Video From Odisha's Ganjam Sparks Outrage

Dalit youth alleges illegal confinement, custodial-style assault

Bhubaneswar : A viral video purportedly showing a young man being brutally assaulted inside a locked room has triggered outrage in Odisha's Ganjam district, with a Dalit youth alleging that he was illegally confined and tortured for nearly three days by a group of men. The incident is reported to have occurred within the jurisdiction of Berhampur Sadar Police Station, although the police have not yet officially verified either the authenticity of the video or the allegations made by the complainant.

The video, which has been widely circulated on social media, appears to show the youth being assaulted inside a locked room. Four individuals are reportedly visible in the footage, with one person allegedly beating the victim while others remain present. The video could not be independently verified. A written complaint purportedly filed by the youth has also surfaced online, naming several individuals as the alleged attackers.

In the complaint, the youth, who identifies himself as a member of the Scheduled Caste community, alleged that he was abducted, illegally confined for nearly three days, physically assaulted, and denied food and water throughout his captivity. He further alleged that he was pressured to participate in illegal activities and was subjected to violence after refusing to comply. Claiming that his life remained under threat, the youth said he had submitted written representations to the President of India, the Prime Minister, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), the Odisha Director General of Police, and the Ganjam district administration, seeking protection and a fair investigation into the incident.

The allegations, coupled with the circulation of the video, have sparked widespread concern on social media, with many users demanding an impartial probe and action against those responsible if the claims are found to be true. As of Sunday morning, the Odisha Police had not issued any official statement confirming the authenticity of the video or the allegations contained in the complaint.

Yogi Govt Faces Heat Over Police Lathi-Charge Against Protestors in Dalit Woman's Murder Case

A video showing Meerut SSP Avinash Pandey pacing up to a police van and repeatedly slapping and hitting an activist, advocate Ravi Gautam, who was already pinned inside the vehicle, has sparked outrage.

New Delhi: The Adityanath government is facing sharp political backlash and scrutiny from the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) after the Uttar Pradesh Police baton-charged Dalit activists and family members protesting the murder of a woman Dalit student in Meerut on July 8.

The incident sparked widespread outrage after a video surfaced showing Meerut Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Avinash Pandey pacing up to a police van and repeatedly slapping and hitting an activist, advocate Ravi Gautam, who was already pinned inside the vehicle.

Police have since arrested seven persons, including Gautam, on charges of unlawful assembly, rioting, and allegedly assaulting police personnel on duty. Officials alleged that the activists incited the deceased student's family, orchestrated an illegal road blockade, and disrupted law and order. Police named 13 persons and booked 50 unnamed others in the FIR, which included charges of attempt to murder and outraging the modesty of women police personnel, reported The Times of India.

'Necessary minimum force'

The unrest stems from the murder of Lalita Gautam, a young Dalit woman who went missing from the Transport Nagar police station area on May 15. Her body was recovered two days later, on May 17, from a village in the Rohta area. Within 48 hours, police arrested the prime suspect Ankush, an acquaintance of Lalita, and later apprehended two others for allegedly destroying evidence.

On July 8, a crowd gathered outside the Meerut Commissioner's office, demanding the arrest of the prime suspect's family members, whom they claim were also involved.

According to Meerut Police, the demonstrators ignored repeated requests to clear a traffic blockade. When the crowd allegedly turned unruly, police deployed "necessary minimum force" to clear the road, said SSP Pandey.

The officer defended the police action, characterising the protest leaders as "criminal elements" exploiting a family's grief. He maintained that before the demonstration, Lalita's family had expressed full satisfaction with the investigation.

"Certain unruly and unlawful elements from outside incited the family and attempted to give the case an unnecessary and different complexion," Pandey said in a video statement. He added that the probe relied on toll booth data and CCTV footage showing Lalita riding a motorcycle with the prime suspect.

According to Pandey, police advised the family that arresting the other individuals would weaken the prosecution's case and potentially benefit the main accused at trial. "We counselled the family, and they agreed," the SSP said, clarifying that no legal action would be taken against the victim's family members.

However, Pandey said the "orchestrators" of the demonstration and the blockade would not be spared. "It has practically become a racket – orchestrating traffic jams and engaging in dalali (brokerage). We will certainly take the strictest possible action against them," he said.

Police identified Digvijay Singh Bhati, who claims to be the president of the Bharatiya Kisan Union (B.R. Ambedkar faction), as the primary orchestrator of the blockade. A resident of Amroha, Bhati was recently externed from the district and faces nine criminal cases. Police added that Ravi Gautam, the advocate seen being assaulted in the police van, also carries a prior record with four FIRs registered against him.

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has taken cognisance of the police crackdown, issuing notices to the UP Home Secretary and the Director General of Police (DGP) after finding prima facie violations of human rights.

The NHRC acted on a complaint filed by the Bhopal-based Dr. Ambedkar Jan Kalyan Samiti, which demanded an independent inquiry and to establish individual police accountability. The organisation alleged that police "unleashed an unprovoked, brutal lathi-charge, inflicting severe physical injuries on multiple protestors."

The complaint specifically flagged the viral footage of senior police officers, stating it showed them "actively committing custodial torture by mercilessly beating defenseless individuals who had already been taken into police custody, demonstrating a complete breakdown of the rule of law and structural violation of personal dignity."

#### Opposition reactions

The police action has triggered condemnation from opposition leaders, who accuse the BJP administration of holding an anti-Dalit bias.

Nagina MP and Aazad Samaj Party (Kanshiram) chief Chandrashekhar Aazad targeted Chief Minister Adityanath on X, stating that the use of force on an aggrieved community reflects the "anti-Dalit and oppressive nature" of the government.

"If the aggrieved family alleges the involvement of others in the case, then instead of suppressing their demands, a fair, transparent, and time-bound investigation should be conducted," Aazad said. "It must be ensured that no guilty person escapes and no innocent person is implicated."

Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav labelled the administration's crackdown "utterly condemnable." "Under BJP rule, the police are breaking records of injustice," Yadav said, sharing a video of the SSP's action against Ravi Gautam. "When the state's top leader himself openly sets an example of insensitivity towards the mother of a deceased, it is futile to expect anything better from his police force."

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge accused the state government of attempting to suppress those demanding accountability, drawing parallels to past high-profile cases of violence against women in the state.

"The murder of Lalita Gautam has exposed the anti-women and anti-Dalit face of the BJP's 'double-engine' government," Kharge said on X. "The nation witnessed how the BJP government suppressed the voices of victims and attempted to shield those connected to power in Hathras and Unnao as well. Now, that same oppressive attitude is being repeated in Meerut."

Responding to the wide criticism of the viral video of him hitting Gautam, SSP Pandey stated: "Our Constitution starts with, 'We the People of India'. It does not talk about any caste, creed, or community. Whatever action was taken, it was against criminals."

The officer added, "We have evidence for everything. We have justification for all our actions along with evidence. We also have evidence against those who came from outside and were saying unwarranted things."

He also said he would offer counselling to those who were making personal comments against him.

Newborn death: Rights panel seeks report from Haryana Health Department, hospitals

Directs authorities to explain ventilator availability, referrals, treatment chronology

Days after the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) sought a report from the Haryana Government over the death of a newborn allegedly due to the non-availability of ventilator support, the Haryana Human Rights Commission (HHRC) has also taken suo motu cognisance of the incident and issued notices to the state government and district authorities.

The newborn died on July 2 after the family allegedly ran from one hospital to another in Hisar and Rohtak in search of ventilator support.

The NHRC had issued a notice to the Chief Secretary on July 6, directing the state government to submit a detailed report within two weeks.

The HHRC Bench, comprising Chairperson Justice Lalit Batra, Judicial Member Kuldip Jain and member Deep Bhatia, has directed the Additional Chief Secretary (Health) to submit a report on the existing policy governing emergency neonatal referrals and inter-hospital coordination, district-wise availability of Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICUs) and neonatal ventilators in government hospitals, and the measures taken after the incident to strengthen emergency neonatal care and prevent similar occurrences.

The Commission has also asked the Director General, Health Services, to furnish details of the total number of ventilators, including neonatal ventilators, in government hospitals, their functional status, equipment lying unused, under repair or non-functional, including ventilators supplied during the Covid-19 pandemic, and whether any state-level audit of critical care equipment has been conducted during the past two years.

According to information placed before the Commission, Hisar Civil Hospital has only one neonatal ventilator in its NICU. Of nearly 40 other ventilators meant for the ICU, around 25 were reportedly lying unused in storage, while about 13 had become non-functional due to technical defects.

The Commission has further directed the Director of Pt BD Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak, to explain the treatment provided to the newborn, the reasons for the non-availability of ventilator support, the occupancy status of NICU beds and ventilators at the relevant time, and whether any alternative arrangements or inter-hospital coordination were attempted.

The Director of Maharaja Agrasen Medical College, Agroha, has also been asked to clarify whether the child was

referred to the institution, the action taken, the availability and occupancy status of NICU beds and ventilators, and the reasons for the inability to provide ventilator support. However, according to available records, the child was not taken to Agroha and was referred directly to PGIMS, Rohtak.

The Civil Surgeon, Hisar, has been directed to submit the complete chronology of the newborn's treatment, referrals and movement from birth till death, along with medical records, details of neonatal ventilators available on the date of the incident, whether neighbouring government hospitals were contacted before successive referrals, and the action taken against officials concerned, if any.

The HHRC has also sought a status report from the District Medical Negligence Board, Hisar, which is probing the circumstances leading to the newborn's death.

2 youths tied to pole, beaten, given electric shocks over theft suspicion in Madhya Pradesh; NHRC takes cognisance

BHOPAL: Two youths were allegedly tied to a pole, beaten, and given electric shocks by villagers on suspicion of theft in Madhya Pradesh's Raisen district.

The assault, which came to light after a video went viral on social media on Saturday evening, has drawn the attention of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), which has taken cognisance of the case.

The incident took place in Karmodiya village under the Raisen Kotwali police station limits. The victims, reportedly from the Bairagi community of Dhaniyakhedi village, were allegedly taken to a farm after being accused of stealing a water pump motor.

According to police, the villagers tied the two youths to a pole and assaulted them in an attempt to force a confession and make them reveal the names of others allegedly involved in the theft. They were also allegedly given electric shocks using a device installed around farms to protect crops from wild animals.

The incident remained under wraps until a video of the assault surfaced on social media on Saturday evening. The footage purportedly shows the victims tied to a pole while several men beat them and administer electric shocks, triggering widespread outrage.

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) took cognisance of the incident after its member, Priyank Kanoongo, shared the video on social media. Kanoongo said the commission had issued the necessary directions in the matter.

Raisen Superintendent of Police (SP) Ashutosh Gupta said the incident occurred on July 4, when villagers apprehended the two suspects on suspicion of stealing irrigation pump motors and brought them to the police station.

"Several stolen motors were recovered from their possession and legal action was taken in the theft case. However, allegations that the suspects were tortured and given electric shocks came to light only after the video surfaced on social media on Saturday," he said.

Gupta said police immediately took cognisance of the viral video, registered a separate case against those involved in the assault, and arrested two accused. Police have identified the arrested men as Jitendra Thakur and Bhanwarlal Thakur, who have been booked on charges including assault and other relevant provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

Efforts are underway to identify and arrest other accused seen in the video, he added.

Police said further investigation is underway, and additional arrests are likely as more suspects are identified from the viral footage.

NHRC issues notice to UP over lathi-charge on protesters demanding justice for murdered Dalit student

NHRC issued notices to the Uttar Pradesh government over alleged police excess against protesters demanding justice for the murder of a Dalit student in Meerut.

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has issued notices to the Uttar Pradesh Director General of Police and the state's Home Secretary over allegations of an unprovoked lathi-charge on people protesting the murder of a 20-year-old Dalit student in Meerut, even as Azad Samaj Party (Kanshi Ram) chief and Nagina MP Chandrashekhar Azad accused the police of using excessive force to suppress those demanding justice.

Lalita Gautam went missing from Meerut's T.P. Nagar area on May 15, and her body was recovered in Rohtak on May 17. The main accused was arrested on May 18, while another person was later arrested for allegedly destroying evidence.

The rights body's intervention comes after allegations that police assaulted demonstrators protesting the murder of Lalita Gautam, including claims that a protester was beaten inside a police vehicle by a senior police officer.

On Friday, Azad was allegedly stopped by police at the Sivaya toll plaza while on his way to the victim's village.

Following hours of negotiations, the district administration arranged a meeting between the MP and the victim's mother and sister at the toll plaza control room in the presence of senior officials.

After meeting the family, Azad assured them of legal and political support in their pursuit of justice.

He demanded a fair investigation into the Dalit girl's murder, strict action against those responsible, and an impartial probe into the police action against protesters.

Heavy security was deployed at the toll plaza ahead of Azad's visit, with barricades erected and traffic restrictions imposed.

A large gathering of Azad Samaj Party supporters led to a tense standoff between party workers and the police for several hours.

Accusing the Uttar Pradesh Police of targeting Dalits protesting the killing, Azad said the use of force against demonstrators was unjustified and alleged that efforts were being made to silence dissent.

He announced that his party would launch an agitation seeking justice for the victim's family and the release of

those arrested during the protests, adding that he would raise the issue in Parliament.

Without naming Bahujan Samaj Party chief Mayawati, Azad also said that issuing statements was not enough and that political leaders should stand alongside victims' families.

His remarks came after Mayawati alleged, without naming anyone, that some political parties and organisations were attempting to exploit Dalit sentiments for political gain.

Joining the criticism of the police action, Samajwadi Party leader Dr Laxman Yadav questioned the conduct of Meerut Senior Superintendent of Police Avinash Pandey over allegations that a protester was slapped inside a police vehicle.

"Police will frame the charges, take people into custody, decide the verdict, and the SSP himself will deliver the punishment. Under what law does an SSP enter a police vehicle and slap a detainee?" Yadav said in a post on X.

In another statement, Yadav said demanding justice for a Dalit daughter could not be treated as a crime and described the SSP's alleged behaviour towards protesters as "highly condemnable."

"The uniform is meant to protect the public and ensure justice, not to suppress their voices. The Yogi government should explain why batons are being used against those demanding justice," he said.

Protesters and opposition leaders, however, have accused the police of using disproportionate force against those seeking justice for the Dalit student's killing, allegations that have now come under the scrutiny of the National Human Rights Commission.

A video of the alleged police excess that surfaced online shows Meerut SSP Avinash Pandey brutally beating protesters. In another video, he is seen stepping inside a police vehicle and repeatedly slapping a detained protester. The protester has been identified as Ravi Gautam.

He can also be heard saying, "Whose father's road is this that you're dirtying?"

Another clip appears to show the officer reprimanding detained protesters, saying, "Netagiri karta hai" ("You are doing politics").

In an official press note defending its actions, Meerut Police maintained that the investigation into Lalita Gautam's murder was progressing and alleged that certain "anti-social and unlawful elements" attempted to divert the case by provoking the victim's family.

According to the police, a large crowd assembled under the pretext of submitting a memorandum, blocked public roads, and disrupted traffic and public order.

The police said officials repeatedly appealed to protesters to disperse and clear the roads. When they allegedly refused, personnel used what the administration described as the "minimum necessary force" to remove the blockade and restore normal traffic.

The press note further stated that individuals allegedly involved in organising the road blockade, instigating protesters, and participating in the demonstration had been identified through video footage and analysis of social media content.

Police named Digvijay Singh, a resident of Amroha district, and Ravi Gautam among those under investigation, claiming that some of the identified individuals had criminal antecedents. Police said legal action was being initiated based on the available evidence.

Protesters and social organisations, however, rejected the police's account and alleged that officers used excessive force against demonstrators, including people who had already been taken into custody.

Samajwadi Party president and former Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav accused the BJP government of unleashing police excess on people demanding justice for a Dalit woman. In a social media post, he condemned the crackdown on the victim's family and protesters, alleging that the administration had responded with force instead of ensuring justice.

जैसे ही यह मामला राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग और उच्च अधिकारियों के संज्ञान में आया, पुलिस महकमे में हड़कंप मच गया. मामले की गंभीरता को देखते हुए विभाग ने तुरंत लापरवाह अफसरों पर हट्टर चलाया है. मामले की सही तरीके से निगरानी न करने और लापरवाही बरतने के लिए शाबाद के मुख्य पुलिस अधिकारी कंथा रेड्डी के खिलाफ चार्जशीट जारी कर दी गई है.

सबइंस्पेक्टर रमेश निलंबित

शिमला जिले में विद्यार्थियों को भारी स्कूल बैग से राहत देने के लिए शिक्षा विभाग ने नए दिशा-निर्देश जारी किए हैं। अब किसी भी छात्र के स्कूल बैग का वजन उसके शारीरिक वजन के 10 प्रतिशत से अधिक नहीं होगा। सभी सरकारी और निजी स्कूलों को समयसारिणी इस तरह बनाने के निर्देश दिए गए हैं कि छात्र केवल आवश्यक किताबें और कॉपियां ही स्कूल लेकर आएंगे। स्कूलों से कार्रवाई रिपोर्ट भी मांगी गई है।

विस्तार

जिले भर के हजारों स्कूली छात्रों को अब भारी भरकम स्कूल बैग उठाने से राहत मिलने वाली है। शिक्षा विभाग ने विद्यार्थियों के स्वास्थ्य को ध्यान में रखते हुए स्कूली बैग के भार को लेकर नए नियम लागू कर दिए हैं। उपनिदेशक उच्च शिक्षा लेखराज भारद्वाज ने इस संबंध में जिले के सभी सरकारी और निजी स्कूलों के प्रधानाचार्यों और मुख्य अध्यापकों को विस्तृत निर्देश जारी किए हैं।

नए नियम: 10% शारीरिक वजन तक सीमित होगा बैग का भार

नए निर्देशों के अनुसार, छात्रों के स्कूल बैग का वजन उनके शारीरिक वजन का केवल 10 प्रतिशत ही निर्धारित किया गया है। यह आदेश तत्काल प्रभाव से लागू होगा। उपनिदेशक ने स्पष्ट किया है कि सभी प्रधानाचार्य और मुख्य अध्यापकों को यह सुनिश्चित करना होगा कि किसी भी छात्र के स्कूल बैग का वजन उसके शारीरिक वजन के 10 प्रतिशत से अधिक न हो। इस कदम का मुख्य उद्देश्य बच्चों की रीढ़ की हड्डी पर पड़ने वाले अत्यधिक दबाव को कम करना और उनके शारीरिक विकास को सुचारू रूप से बढ़ावा देना है।

समय-सारिणी में बदलाव और आवश्यक पुस्तकों पर जोर

इन निर्देशों के साथ ही, उपनिदेशक ने सभी प्रधानाचार्यों और मुख्य अध्यापकों से स्कूलों में ऐसी समय-सारिणी (टाइम टेबल) तैयार करने का भी आग्रह किया है, जिससे विद्यार्थियों को प्रतिदिन केवल आवश्यक पुस्तकें और कॉपियां ही स्कूल लानी पड़ें। इससे बैग का अनावश्यक भार कम करने में मदद मिलेगी।

राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग के निर्देशों का पालन

आदेशों में राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग द्वारा निर्धारित दिशा-निर्देशों का भी पूर्ण पालन सुनिश्चित करने को कहा गया है। यह कदम बच्चों के अधिकारों और उनके स्वस्थ विकास को सुनिश्चित करने की दिशा में एक महत्वपूर्ण प्रयास है।

कार्रवाई रिपोर्ट जमा करने के निर्देश

श्रमिकों को बंधक बनाकर काम कराने में होगी मजिस्ट्रियल जांच

मुजफ्फरनगर के तितावी गांव में दोना-पत्तल फैक्ट्री में 13 श्रमिकों को बंधक बनाकर डेढ़ साल तक मजदूरी कराई गई। पुलिस ने कार्रवाई करते हुए श्रमिकों को मुक्त कराया। मुख्य आरोपी अंकित बालियान को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया है। राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग ने मजिस्ट्रियल जांच के आदेश दिए हैं।

मुजफ्फरनगर तितावी के गांव मांडी में दोना-पत्तल फैक्ट्री में श्रमिकों को बंधक बनाकर मजदूरी कराने के मामले में मजिस्ट्रियल जांच भी होगी। मानवाधिकार आयोग से भेजा गया पत्र डीएम को मिल गया है। अब इस मामले में डीएम के स्तर से मजिस्ट्रियल जांच के लिए टीम गठित होगी। तितावी पुलिस ने नीमका जेल पहुंचकर मुख्य आरोपी के बयान दर्ज कर लिए हैं। तितावी के गांव मांडी में दोना-पत्तल बनाने की फैक्ट्री में बिहार, राजस्थान, हरियाणा, उत्तराखंड समेत नेपाल के 13 श्रमिकों को बंधक बनाकर डेढ़ वर्ष तक मजदूरी कराई गई थी। पुलिस व प्रशासनिक अधिकारियों ने मौके पर पहुंचकर श्रमिकों को बंधनमुक्त कराया था।

पुलिस ने इस मामले में फैक्ट्री मालिक अंकित बालियान के पिता प्रदीप बालियान समेत तीन आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार कर जेल भेजा था। मुख्यारोपी अंकित बालियान को हरियाणा के पलवल जिले के होडल थाना पुलिस ने तमंचे के साथ गिरफ्तार किया था। तितावी पुलिस ने न्यायालय से अनुमति मिलने के बाद मुख्य आरोपी के फरीदाबाद स्थित नीमका जेल पहुंचकर शनिवार को बयान दर्ज किए हैं। इस मामले में एसआइटी ने जांच कर रही है। राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग ने भी मामले पर संज्ञान लेकर डीएम को मजिस्ट्रियल जांच के आदेश दिए हैं। जल्द ही मजिस्ट्रियल जांच के लिए टीम का गठन किया जाएगा।

बाइक चोरी के शक में युवकों पर क्रूरता, रायसेन घटना में NHRC की एंट्री के बाद 2 आरोपी गिरफ्तार

रायसेन घटना में NHRC की एंट्री के बाद 2 आरोपी गिरफ्तार

Raisen (Madhya Pradesh): रविवार को मध्य प्रदेश के रायसेन से सोशल मीडिया पर एक चौंकाने वाला वीडियो सामने आया, जिसमें दो युवकों को बिजली के झटके दिए जा रहे हैं। इसके बाद नेशनल ह्यूमन राइट्स कमीशन (NHRC) भी हरकत में आया। जानकारी के मुताबिक, पीड़ितों के साथ मोटर चोरी के शक में अमानवीय व्यवहार किया गया। यह घटना रायसेन थाने के करमोदिया गांव में हुई। बताया जा रहा है कि पीड़ित धनियाखेड़ी गांव के रहने वाले हैं और बैरागी समुदाय से हैं।

यह वीडियो सोशल मीडिया पर खूब शेयर हो रहा है और इसे "अमानवीय सज़ा" कहा जा रहा है। नेटिज़न्स ने यह भी कहा कि भारत में कैदियों के साथ भी ऐसा व्यवहार करने की इजाज़त नहीं है।

परेशान करने वाले दृश्य सामने आए वीडियो में, पीड़ितों को एक खेत में खंभे से बंधा हुआ देखा जा सकता है। उन्हें पीटा जा रहा है और जंगली जानवरों से फसलों को बचाने वाले एक डिवाइस का इस्तेमाल करके बिजली के झटके दिए जा रहे हैं, कथित तौर पर उनसे चोरी कबूल करवाने के लिए। यह घटना तब सामने आई जब शनिवार शाम को सोशल मीडिया पर कथित हमले का वीडियो वायरल हुआ। दो गिरफ्तार वीडियो के बाद, पुलिस ने जांच शुरू की और FIR दर्ज की। दो संदिग्धों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया है, जबकि इसमें शामिल अन्य लोगों की पहचान करने और उन्हें पकड़ने की कोशिश की जा रही है।

SDPO प्रतिभा शर्मा ने कहा, "आज पुलिस के सामने एक वायरल वीडियो आया है, जिसमें दो लोगों को, जिन्हें चोर कहा जा रहा है, कुछ लोग पीट रहे हैं और उनके साथ गाली-गलौज कर रहे हैं। इस मामले में शुरुआती कार्रवाई कोतवली पुलिस ने की, जिसमें 4 जुलाई के आसपास दोनों संदिग्धों के खिलाफ FIR दर्ज की गई। दोनों मोटरसाइकिल और स्कूटर चोरी करते पाए गए, जिसके आधार पर कोतवली पुलिस स्टेशन में मामला दर्ज किया गया।" स्थानीय लोगों ने बताया कि पानी की मोटर चोरी के शक में दोनों युवकों को एक खेत में ले जाया गया।

कहा जाता है कि उन्हें एक खंभे से बांधकर पीटा गया। बताया जाता है कि संदिग्धों ने उनसे चोरी में कथित तौर पर शामिल अन्य लोगों के नाम उगलवाने की कोशिश की। यह मामला तब सुर्खियों में आया जब ऑनलाइन एक वीडियो सामने आया जिसमें कुछ लोग कथित तौर पर एक युवक को खंभे से बांधकर पीट रहे थे और उसे बिजली के झटके दे रहे थे। वीडियो वायरल होने के बाद, पुलिस ने तुरंत जांच शुरू की। NHRC ने संज्ञान लिया नेशनल ह्यूमन राइट्स कमीशन (NHRC) ने भी इस घटना पर संज्ञान लिया है। NHRC के सदस्य प्रियांक कानूनगो ने सोशल मीडिया पर वीडियो शेयर किया और कहा कि कमीशन ने मामले पर संज्ञान लिया है और ज़रूरी निर्देश जारी किए हैं। पुलिस ने जितेंद्र ठाकुर और भंवरलाल ठाकुर के खिलाफ मारपीट और दूसरे अपराधों से जुड़ी धाराओं के तहत केस दर्ज किया है। दोनों संदिग्धों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया है, जबकि वीडियो में दिख रहे दूसरे लोगों की पहचान वेरिफ़ाई की जा रही है और आगे की जांच चल रही है।

दिलजीत दोसांझ की सतलुज पर रवनीत सिंह बिट्टू की वॉर्निंग, पंजाब BJP नेता लालपुरा ने कहा लिमिट में रहो, गरमाई सियासत

रेलवे और फूड प्रोसेसिंग इंडस्ट्रीज़ के केंद्रीय राज्य मंत्री रवनीत सिंह बिट्टू ने जसवंत सिंह खालरा की बायोपिक 'सतलुज' के मेकर्स को चुनौती दी। उन्होंने कहा कि वे पंजाब में 25,000 लोगों के लापता होने या गैर-कानूनी तरीके से अंतिम संस्कार किए जाने के दावों के लिए दस्तावेजी सबूत और सरकारी रिकॉर्ड दिखाएं।

चंडीगढ़ : पंजाब में दिलजीत दोसांझ की फिल्म सतलुज पर सियासी विवाद खड़ा हो गया है। राजनीतिक बयानबाजी शुरू हो गई। मामला इतना बढ़ा कि भारतीय जनता पार्टी के बड़े नेताओं में से एक, इकबाल सिंह लालपुरा ने केंद्रीय मंत्री रवनीत सिंह बिट्टू को अपनी हद में रहने की चेतावनी दी है। इससे पता चलता है कि दिलजीत दोसांझ की फिल्म 'सतलुज' पर पार्टी के रुख को लेकर राज्य इकाई में बेचैनी है। इस सार्वजनिक विवाद की शुरुआत बिट्टू के उस बयान से हुई जिसमें उन्होंने विवादित फिल्म के इस दावे को चुनौती दी थी कि राज्य में उग्रवाद के दौर में 25,000 अज्ञात शवों का चुपचाप निपटारा किया गया था।

केंद्रीय मंत्री ने इस हफ्ते की शुरुआत में कहा कि अगर कहीं भी 25,000... जिन अज्ञात शवों की उन्होंने बात की है, अगर वह डेटा सच है, तो उन्हें वह लिस्ट आपके सामने दिखानी चाहिए। 25,000 तो छोड़िए, मैं तो कहता हूँ कि 5,000 का डेटा भी वे मीडिया के सामने, अपने आयोग के सामने और सुप्रीम कोर्ट या हाई कोर्ट में पेश करें।

लालपुरा ने इस दावे को खारिज कर दिया

लालपुरा ने कहा कि हर किसी को अपनी सीमा में रहना चाहिए। जब जसवंत खालरा (जिन पर यह फ़िल्म आधारित है) ने 25,000 लोगों के गायब होने के बारे में बात की थी, तो उन्होंने एक संदेश दिया था। इस दावे की पुष्टि राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग (NHRC) ने की थी। अगर बिट्टू साहिब को यह डेटा चाहिए, तो वे इसे NHRC से ले सकते हैं।

लालपुरा, जो भारतीय पुलिस सेवा (IPS) के पूर्व अधिकारी हैं, उन तीन पुलिस अधिकारियों में शामिल हैं जिन्होंने निरंकारी संप्रदाय के सदस्यों के साथ हुई झड़प के सिलसिले में उग्रवादी नेता जरनैल सिंह भिंडरावाले को गिरफ्तार किया था। 'सतलुज' को 2022 में सेंसर बोर्ड के पास भेजा गया था। इसे आखिरकार 3 जुलाई को OTT प्लेटफॉर्म ZEE5 पर रिलीज किया गया। दो दिन बाद, प्लेटफॉर्म ने इसे हटा दिया और कहा कि वे दूसरे विकल्पों पर विचार कर रहे हैं।

बेअंत सिंह के पोते ने उठाए सवाल

पंजाब के मारे गए मुख्यमंत्री बेअंत सिंह के पोते बिट्टू ने एक लिखित बयान में पूछा कि अगर यह आंकड़ा सिर्फ अंदाजे या आरोप पर आधारित है, तो इसे एक स्थापित ऐतिहासिक तथ्य के तौर पर क्यों दिखाया गया? दर्शकों को यह क्यों नहीं बताया गया कि यह संख्या किसी अंतिम न्यायिक फ़ैसले से पक्के तौर पर साबित नहीं हुई है?

पंजाब पुलिस के बलिदान को छिपाने का आरोप

मानवाधिकार कार्यकर्ता खालरा का अपहरण 31 अगस्त, 1995 को बेअंत सिंह की हत्या के पांच दिन बाद कर लिया गया था और बाद में उनकी हत्या कर दी गई थी। बिट्टू ने फिल्म में पंजाब के सबसे काले दौर को अंधूरा दिखाने और चुनिंदा घटनाओं को ही पेश करने पर भी सवाल उठाए। उन्होंने पूछा कि आतंकवादियों द्वारा बेरहमी से मारे गए बेगुनाह हिंदुओं, बस यात्रियों, दुकानदारों, सरकारी कर्मचारियों, मजदूरों और आम नागरिकों के नरसंहार को उसी

तीव्रता के साथ क्यों नहीं दिखाया गया? आतंकवाद से लड़ने वाले पंजाब पुलिस के जवानों, सुरक्षा बलों और अनगिनत बहादुर नागरिकों के भारी बलिदान को कम करके क्यों दिखाया गया?

कांग्रेस के पूर्व तीन बार के सांसद बिट्टू ने कहा कि हम सभी उचित कानूनी और संवैधानिक उपायों पर विचार करेंगे ताकि यह सुनिश्चित किया जा सके कि देश के सामने ऐतिहासिक तथ्यों को गलत तरीके से पेश न किया जाए। बिट्टू बीजेपी में शामिल हो गए थे और 2024 का लोकसभा चुनाव हारने के बावजूद उन्हें केंद्रीय कैबिनेट में राज्य मंत्री बनाया गया था।

बिट्टू ने कहा कि किसी भी ज़िम्मेदार फ़िल्ममेकर को विवादित आंकड़ों को बिना सवाल के सच बताकर इतिहास को तोड़ने-मरोड़ने का अधिकार नहीं है। उन्होंने कहा कि पंजाब ने आतंकवाद के दौर में बहुत भारी कीमत चुकाई है। हर बेगुनाह पीड़ित न्याय और याद किए जाने का हकदार है - चाहे उसका धर्म, समुदाय या विचारधारा कुछ भी हो।

DD Bar Murder Case : बिष्टुपुर में पुलिस वैन से खींचकर युवक की हत्या मामले में NHRC सख्त, डायरी नंबर जारी

जमशेदपुर में पुलिस की मौजूदगी में हुए जानलेवा हमले में हिमांशु सिंह की मौत का मामला राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग (NHRC) तक पहुंच गया है।

जागरण संवाददाता, जमशेदपुर। बिष्टुपुर थाना क्षेत्र में पुलिस की मौजूदगी में दो युवकों पर हुए जानलेवा हमले और बाद में करणी सेना सरायकेला युवा जिलाध्यक्ष हिमांशु सिंह की मौत का मामला अब राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग (NHRC) तक पहुंच गया है।

आयोग ने इस मामले में दायर शिकायत को आधिकारिक तौर पर स्वीकार करते हुए डायरी संख्या 15568/IN/2026 जारी कर दी है। आयोग ने शिकायत प्राप्त होने की पुष्टि करते हुए इसे आगे की प्रक्रिया के लिए दर्ज कर लिया है।

पुलिस की मौजूदगी में अनुच्छेद-21 का उल्लंघन

यह शिकायत झारखंड मानवाधिकार सम्मेलन (JHRC) के प्रमुख मनोज मिश्रा द्वारा राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग को भेजी गई थी। शिकायत में गंभीर आरोप लगाया गया है कि बिष्टुपुर में पुलिस वैन से दो युवकों को खींचकर अपराधियों ने उन पर बेरहमी से जानलेवा हमला किया।

इस घटना में गंभीर रूप से घायल हिमांशु ने दो दिन बाद अस्पताल में दम तोड़ दिया, जबकि दूसरा युवक प्रत्युष अब भी अस्पताल में ज़िंदगी और मौत के बीच संघर्ष कर रहा है।

मनोज मिश्रा ने शिकायत में कहा कि यदि पुलिस अभिरक्षा या पुलिस की मौजूदगी में किसी नागरिक की सुरक्षा सुनिश्चित नहीं हो पाती और उसकी मृत्यु हो जाती है, तो यह भारतीय संविधान के अनुच्छेद-21 का उल्लंघन है।

उच्च स्तरीय जांच और ₹1 करोड़ मुआवजे की मांग

मानवाधिकार संगठन ने पूरे मामले की स्वतंत्र, निष्पक्ष और उच्च स्तरीय जांच कराने की मांग की है। इसके साथ ही शिकायत में निम्नलिखित प्रमुख मांगें उठाई गई हैं:

दोषियों पर एक्शन: हमलावरों के अलावा घटना के समय लापरवाही बरतने वाले संबंधित पुलिसकर्मियों के खिलाफ सख्त कानूनी कार्रवाई हो।

मुआवजा: मृतक हिमांशु के आश्रित परिजनों को एक करोड़ रुपये का मुआवजा दिया जाए।

रोजगार: पीड़ित परिवार के एक सदस्य को सरकारी नौकरी दी जाए।

सुरक्षा व इलाज: गंभीर रूप से घायल दूसरे युवक प्रत्युष के इलाज और सुरक्षा की पुख्ता व्यवस्था सुनिश्चित की जाए।

प्रशासन और पुलिस की बढ़ती जवाबदेही

एनएचआरसी द्वारा डायरी नंबर जारी किए जाने को इस मामले में महत्वपूर्ण प्रगति माना जा रहा है। मानवाधिकार कार्यकर्ता मनोज मिश्रा का कहना है कि यदि जांच में पुलिस की लापरवाही या मिलीभगत सामने आती है, तो संबंधित अधिकारियों की जवाबदेही तय होनी चाहिए।

अब इस मामले में सभी की निगाहें राष्ट्रीय मानवाधिकार आयोग की आगामी कार्रवाई पर टिकी हैं। यदि आयोग झारखंड सरकार और पुलिस महानिदेशक से Report तलब करता है, तो यह मामला राज्य में कानून-व्यवस्था और पुलिसिया कार्यप्रणाली पर एक गंभीर बहस का विषय बन सकता है।
