Proceedings of the Workshop on Awareness and Facilitating Assessment and enforcement of Human Rights at District Level Administration held at Hoshiarpur on 30th November 2009

In continuation to the Human Rights Awareness & Facilitating Assessment of Enforcement of Human Rights Programme in selected 28 districts of the country, the National Human Rights Commission had organised 12th workshop at Hoshiarpur District in Punjab on 30th November 2009. The workshop was attended by, Shri Sood, Cabinet Minister for Forest, Govt. of Punjab, Shri Avinash Rai Khanna, Member, Punjab State Human Rights Commission, Shri A.K. Jain, Secretary General, NHRC, Dr. Sanjay Dubey, Director (A), NHRC, Shri Meghraj, Deputy Commissioner, Shri Pramod Bhan, SSP, Shri Sushil Kumar, SP, Shri D.R. Bhagat, ADC, Shri Bhupinder Singh, District Goods Officer, Shri Lakhvinder Singh Dhariwal, District Development and Panchayat Officer, Capt. Karnail Singh, ADC and other Panchayat workers, Members of NGOs and general public.

The Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, in his opening remarks welcomed the NHRC team. He said that Hoshiarpur has achieved highest literacy under NREGA scheme in Punjab. Literacy is being integrated under NREGA scheme. They are publishing books in which Punjab Government and Central Govt. schemes are advertised so that people at grass root level can take advantage of different welfare schemes.

Acting Chairperson, NHRC said that NHRC team was very pleased to come to Hoshiarpur in relation to Human Rights Awareness Programme. It is very good news to know that many people from this district, after their education, have reached to very high positions like Army General, IAS etc. India's Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh studied here and also taught as a professor here. Hon'ble ACP informed that Planning Commission has selected some districts which are backward and out of those NHRC has selected 28 districts and Hoshiarpur is one of them. This was the reason to select and come to Hoshiarpur to organize a human rights awareness programme here. The Deputy Commissioner had informed that there are

35% scheduled castes population. Perhaps this is the reason, the Planning Commission has declared Hoshiarpur as backward district. Scheduled castes have been deprived of many benefits, they face more problems, some social and some economic. Human Rights Commission is focusing on right to food, health, bonded labour, child labour, custodial justice and rights of SCs and STs.

On this occasion, Shri Sood, Minister for Forests, Punjab Govt., welcomed Justice G.P. Mathur, ACP and NHRC team. He said that Hoshiarpur district has given many IAS, Army Generals, present Prime Minister etc. NHRC team has come here with a hope that we will gain success in this programme. Legal justice and natural justice are different. Legal justice can be twisted but natural justice cannot be broken. Human Rights Commission is a body which helps those who are helpless. He thanked the NHRC team for selecting Hoshiarpur district. He said that as he had been informed by District Commissioner, Hoshiarpur is top in literacy. People have interest in literacy. Every person here is born with CPC under arm. People here are legally aware. Cases of this district have gone upto Supreme Court. He said that although this district is first in literacy under NREGA but poverty is here.

Shri A.K. Jain, Secretary General, NHRC thanked the Administration for responding to NHRC's request of organizing a Human Rights Awareness programme at Hoshiapur. He said that all the representatives are here and they will talk to them directly on human rights issues. In carpet industry, child labour problem is there because foreign countries have denied our goods specially because child labour is being employed in this industry. He suggested that in every country, there should be a separate institute which can implement international standards. He mentioned that general impression in the mind of public is that Administration is not sensitive towards them. Either it is harassment, corruption etc., Administration is very arrogant especially towards those who are poor, who are not well-off; they are not getting administrative benefits. For our Commission, the concern is why the

public is unheard, what is the standard so that we can be directly involved with the public. This is the objective of this programme.

Shri Avinash Rai Khanna, Member, Punjab State Human Rights Commission personally on his behalf and on behalf of Punjab State Human Rights Commission thanked Justice G.P. Mathur and NHRC team for organizing Human Rights Awareness Programme. He said that as had been told how Hoshiarpur district was selected as backward district, this may be because the geographical situation of this district is different from other districts in Punjab. There may be another reason such as small holdings and less connectivity of rail and road. He mentioned that Hoshiarpur district has given many educated persons like the present Police Commissioner of Delhi, Chief Secretary of Madhya Pradesh. There is big contribution of NRIs from Hoshiarpur district.

Shri Khanna said non-performance of duty creates Human Rights violation. When people do not get justice from here, then they go to other agencies. 70% people come only to tell their grievances. Only if their grievances are heard attentively, 70% problems are solved. 20% complaints are such, where a little action is required; only in 10% complaints, maximum consideration is required.

Shri Khanna said that people are lying in jail for no reason. Two persons he met were in jail for no reason. He talked to DCP and got them released. Shri Khanna said that he saw in hospital that one person was chained while he was in hospital bed. He raised the issue and directed the district officials to follow Supreme Court and High Court guidelines properly. He said that 31 lakh pensioners had not got their pension for the last 7 months. The Punjab State Human Rights Commission took suo moto action and then Govt. released the pension of the pensioners. He mentioned about the facilities being provided by Punjab State Human Rights Commission. Mr. Khanna said that every information is given to applicant free of cost, either by post, by fax, or by e-mail. Shri Khanna assured that the decisions / suggestions of this workshop will be implemented wholly.

Dr. Sanjay Dubey, Director (A) NHRC welcomed Shri Sood, Hon'ble Minister for Forest, Punjab Govt., Shri Abhiraj Khanna, Member, Punjab State Human Rights Commission, Shri Meghraj, Deputy Commissioner, SSP, other District officers, members of NGOs and general public who attended the workshop. He said that the essence of Human Rights lies in Bhagwat Geeta that is called "Karmanayva adhikareste..... If an officer does not do his duty, then he is not liable to be called an officer. He stressed that administration There should not be neglect of should be human-face centred. administration. The instance of 26th November, 2008 -Mumbai attack was cited. It took 12-14 hours for NSG to reach there. Administration is there, but delivery is not there. He said that in 2-3 districts in Orissa, people are dying of hunger, while in Punjab the grain is decaying in Mandis. As per human development index, there are two least poverty States in India - one is J&K and another is Punjab. He said that Hoshiarpur was 12th out of 28 districts where Human Rights Awareness programme had been organized. In 2005, two big things happened - one NREGA was started and RTI Act was implemented. The biggest programme for education today is Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan where more and more children can get education.

Secretary General, NHRC gave introduction about National Human Rights Commission, its composition, its functions, investigation, independent complaint system etc. He said that first we ask for reports from State Govt. If we think that the report is not proper, we even send our team for investigation purpose or in some sensitive cases we send our own investigation team. There are State level Human Rights Commissions. The jurisdiction of State Human Rights Commissions is different. National Human Rights Commission has jurisdiction all over India but State Human Rights Commission has jurisdiction for which area State legislature can make law. He informed the gathering about complaint handling system and its procedure. It was informed that India is 'A' category member of ICC. This grading is made by review of Human Rights institutions at international level. Then SG gave presentation through slides.

Later the participants were guided to form four groups for discussion on the specific human rights issues. The basic idea behind this was to adopt a basic participative approach, understand the problems faced by the administration in discharging their responsibilities and also to come out with some recommendations that according to them will help them in functioning in a better manner.

The issues for group presentation were as under:

- Group I: Right to Food and evaluation of measures taken to ensure the same including responsibility of Panchayat, food adulteration and Human Rights of SC & ST communities and other vulnerable sections of society
- Group III: Right to Education and evaluation of measures to ensure the same.
- Group II: Right to Custodial Justice and evaluation of measures to ensure the same.
- Group IV: Right to Health, Hygiene, Sanitation, environmental issues including drug adulteration and evaluation of measures to ensure the same to Health and Environment Issues.

The presentations stating the problems and recommendations made by the groups in the concluding session of the workshop are enclosed at **Annexure I to Annexure IV**. From the field visit reports, discussions and presentations at the workshop the following suggestions emerged:

A. Rights to food and evaluation of measures taken to ensure the same including the responsibility of Panchayat, food adulteration issues, human rights of SC/ST communities and other vulnerable sections of society.

- BPL Cards were not issued as per the eligibility criteria; some of the wealthy peoples are also having BPL cards.
- Vigilance Committees have not been formed since last two years.
- Quality of food grains should be improves as there are questions regarding adulteration and sub-standard material is being supplied to the beneficiaries under the Govt. schemes.
- There is huge quantity of dal but it is decaying. It is not being sent
 to the market otherwise rates will come down. The holders of food
 grains are not being caught. Something should be done to arrest
 price rise.
- One of the participants raised the issue of non preparations of ration cards since last 13 years and also cards for the muslims.
 Matter needs the attention.

B. Right to Education and evaluation of measures to ensure the same.

- Member, Punjab State Human Rights Commission pointed out whether +2 vocational degrees is recognized by Army recruitment agencies? On this, District Education Officer replied in negative.
 Acting Chairperson, NHRC observed that this is very serious matter. State is giving degree and students are not getting job. If it is correct, then appropriate steps should be taken.
- The Govt. Primary school in Village Bagpur is 150 years old and in appox. 1.5 acre. There is lack of teachers in the school, at present there are only three lady teachers were working. Total student are 85. There are three classrooms in the school.
- In Govt. Primary School Bhikhowal, total strength of the students is 125. There are only 3 teachers and seven classrooms for children in the school.
- C. Right to Custodial Justice and evaluation of measures to ensure the same.

- Member, PSHRC made an observation that once he went to jai and jail inmates made a complaint that they are taken to hospital after the time is over. Guard problem is also cited. On this, Jail Superintendent told that now guards are being provided on regular basis. Sometime they take help of SSP.
- Jail hospital maintains two registers one under the Jail Manual and another under NHRC guidelines. It was suggested to merge two registers into one.
- One Tubewell out of two was not working in jail for the last 6 months because of which sufficient water was not being provided.
 S.D.O., Punjab Police Housing Corporation promised that it will be rectified or new tubewell will be provided within one week. Deputy Commissioner said that the matter is lingering. If it is not completed within 15 days, action will be taken.
- Guidelines laid down by NHRC are required to be strictly followed.
- The grievances of Sentry on duty was that although fans have been provided in 24 other jails of Punjab but in Hoshiarpur jail, this facility has not been provided. It was also mentioned that there are no promotion avenues for Constables in Jail Deptt.

JUVENILE HOME, HOSHIARPUR

- It was observed that 24 inmates at the JJ home appeared to be above 18 years of age; however as per documentary proof they are juveniles. These cases may be referred for age verification through medical examination by competent authority.
- This is a serious issue and required prompt action because keeping small children with adults having bad record adversely affect the children.
- There are juveniles of foreign nationals in the Juvenile Home, this issue required to be expedited.

- D. Right to Health, Hygiene, Sanitation, environmental issues including drug adulteration and evaluation of measures to ensure the same to Health and Environment Issues.
 - The Deputy Commissioner observed that for each insurance card for BPL families, Govt. of India is contributing Rs. 750 while Rs. 250/- is being contributed by State Govt. Around Rs. 1.00 crore has been spent but benefit of only Rs. 61,500/- has been taken. For this, awareness should be increased so that maximum people can benefit from this scheme.
 - The procedure for preparation of disability certificates in the hospital should be simplified. The certificates should be issued in a reasonable time frame.
 - Sufficient staff (inspectors) may be posted at tehsil/ district level for checking drug adulteration.

Field Visits report of NHRC team conducted at Hoshiarpur district in Punjab

The team of NHRC consisting Justice Shri G.P. Mathur, Acting Chairperson, Shri A.K.Jain, Secretary General, Dr. Sanjay Dubey, Director (A) and Mahabeer Singh, PS to Acting Chairperson paid visit to the District Hoshiarpur of Punjab in pursuance of the Human Rights Awareness Programmes in selected 28 districts of the country. The team also visited the district Jail Amritsar. Dr. Sanjay Dubey, Director, NHRC visited in advance to the district to interact with the district authorities regarding the awareness programme, he also paid visits on 27.11.2009 and 28.11.2009 to review the situation of Anganwadi Centres, Schools, Police Station and Community Health Centre in the district thereafter he joined the other member of the team on 30th Nov 2009. The objective of the programme is to evaluate and facilitate the implementation of programmes based up on human rights.

The focus area of the visit being right to health, right to custodial justice, and the team carried out the survey of the institutions responsible for ensuring these rights.

The team visited following places:

- Anganwadi Centre, Village Bagpur on 27.11.2009
- Anganwadi Centre, Village Bhikhowal on 27.11.2009
- Govt. Primary School in Village Bagpur on 27.11.2009
- Govt. Primary School, Village Bhikhowal on 27.11.2009
- City Police Station Hoshiarpur on 28.11.2009
- Community Health Centre Mahilpur on 28.11.2009
- District Jail, Hoshiarpur on 01.12.2009
- Juvenile Home, Hoshiarpur on 01.12.2009
- Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur on 01.12.2009

District Jail, Amritsar on 3.12.2009

Angan Wadi Center , Village Bagpur

Observations:

- The centre is working in Govt. Elementary School village Bagpur
- There are 19 children are enrolled and food is prepared in well manner.
- Attendance of children was on 14-15 out of enrolled 19.
- The center is located in the school and there is apparent difference in regard to cooking of meal for children of Anganwadi centre and midday meal for student of school. School is provided LPG gas whereas anganwadi centre is using fire woods for cooking. A uniform treatment should be provided for schools and anganwadi centre for cooking.

Angan Wadi Center Bhikhowal

Observations:

- The center is 20 year old and total 20 children are enrolled.
- The worker is high school passed.
- Weight measuring machine was not available with the centre.
- Nutrition Chart was not up dated since last two-three months.
- The center is located in the school and there is apparent difference in regard to cooking of meal for children of Anganwadi centre and midday meal for student of school. School is provided LPG gas whereas anganwadi centre is using fire woods for cooking. A uniform treatment should be provided for schools and anganwadi centre for cooking

Govt. Primary school in Village Bagpur

Observations:

- The school building is 150 years old and in appox. 1.5 acre

- At present only three lady teacher were working. Total students are 85.
 There are only three classrooms in the school
- LPG is being used for cooking of mid day meal which was provided by the Govt. Pressure Cooker and food containers provided by the Panchayat.
- Anganwadi Centre should not be in the premises of school.

Govt. Primary School Bhikhowal

- Total strength of the students in school is 125. There are only 3 teachers and classrooms for children are seven in the school.
- LPG is being used for cooking of mid day meal.
- Anganwadi Centre running in the school, which should be in separate premises.

City Police Station, Hoshiarpur

Observations:

- In-charge of the Police Station was an Inspector
- Total staff strength is 82 i.e. 13 Head Constables, 21 Constables including 4 lady constables and 48 Home Guards.
- There were 6 NOG's including on Lady NGO for the assistance of people in the police station.
- One person was in custody in the Police lockup under section 420 of I.P.C.

Community Health Centre, Mahilpur

- In charge of the CHC was Dr. Devinder Singh, there are 4 Specialist Doctors, one Sr. Medical Officer and 5 Staff Nurses in the Centre.
- Facility of Homeopathy treatment is also available in the CHC.
- O.P.D. timings of CHC was 9.00 A.M. to 3.00 P.M in winter and 8.00 A.M to 2.00 P.M in summer season.

247

Daily on an average 100 cases are being registered in OPD and also
 5-6 emergency cases such as accidental and local people internal clashes comes to the CHC.

District Jail, Hoshiarpur

- Capacity of in-take of the prison is 278. (Male 258 & female 20).
- Total number of inmates as on 01.12.2009 is 694 (Convicted 175 and undertrials 519). Population statement of prison as on 1.12.2009 is placed at Annexure V
- Sanctioned staff strength of the prison is 82 out of them 4 are vacant. The vacant post should be filled up at the earliest.
- There are two separate barracks and one cell for women in jail.
- Two custodial deaths were reported in 2009.
- An officer of the Punjab State Legal Services Authority, Chandigarh
 is visiting jail every week to provide legal aid. Every inmate of the
 jail is informed about their right to have legal aid at the time of their
 admission in jail by the jail authority.
- Civil prisoners are also kept in jail.
- Inside the jail, there is a hospital for inmates.
- There is only one doctor and one pharmacist.
- Doctor is for 24 hours. He resides in jail campus itself.
- Jail hospital maintains two registers one under the Jail Manual and another under NHRC guidelines. It was suggested to merge two registers into one.
- One Tubewell out of two was not working in jail for the last 6 months because of which sufficient water was not being provided.
 S.D.O., Punjab Police Housing Corporation promised that it will be rectified or new tubewell will be provided within one week. Deputy Commissioner said that the matter is lingering. If it is not completed within 15 days, action will be taken.
- The grievances of Sentry on duty was that although fans have been provided in 24 other jails of Punjab but in Hoshiarpur jail, this facility

has not been provided. It has also mentioned that there are no promotion avenues for Constables in Jail Department.

JUVENILE HOME, HOSHIARPUR

Observations:

- The total number of inmates in JJ Home, Hoshiarpur is 67.
- Out of 67, 10 are convicts and 57 are under trial inmates.
- There are juveniles of foreign countries in the Juvenile Home.
 This issue need to be expedited. Five inmates are alleged to be from Myanmar.
- Some of the inmates at the JJ home appeared to be above 18 years of age. List of such juvenile is enclosed at Annexure VI
- In this regard the Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur stated said that those who are looking above 18 years will be sent for age verification or medical examination.

Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur

The team visited Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur. The hospital has the capacity of 200 beds. The hospital came into existence on 14.2.1959 with 50 beds capacity & was later upgraded to 200 in 1985. The hospital has got 35 medical officers of different specialties including six emergency medical officers. The hospital is giving round the clock emergency services like Laboratory, X-Ray, Blood Bank & ambulance services. Profile of the civil hospital is enclosed at **Annexure - VII**

- Total number of beds in District Civil Hospital is 200 with all specialization facilities.
- 800-900 patients are attended daily.
- AID Day was being celebrated in the hospital. AIDS medicines are costly but they are being provided free of cost by the hospital.

- The hospital has all the facilities including cancer treatment,
 AIDS treatment, Laboratory, X-ray, Blood Bank, Ambulance services and specialists in all branches of medicine.
- In OPD, Rs. 2/- are charged for making card. For old, poor etc., card is made free of cost.
- There is an NRI fund. In this fund, at present there are Rs.
 6,00,000/-. Medical facilities are provided for poor people from this fund.
- OPD is fully computerized.
- Telemedicine facility is available in the hospital. The treating doctor directly talks to Specialist, PGI, Chandigarh or Medical College, Ludhiana.
- The hospital has other facilities like Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH), Ayurvedic, Yoga, Unani, Sidha Homeopathy (AYUSH) and Rashtriya Swast Bima Yojana (RSBY).

DISTRICT JAIL, AMRITSAR

- In district jail, there are 2571 inmates. Out of which, 2447 are male and 124 are female.
- There are total 837 convicts, out of which 794 are male and 43 are female.
- There are 85 internees out of which 78 are male and 07 are females. Population statement of prison as on 3.12.2009 is placed at Annexure - VIII
- There are two jail; one Central Jail No. 1 and another Central Jail No.2.
- Civil prisoners are also kept there; some time for 10 days and sometime even for 14 days.
- There are 54 Pak Internees. SSP initiates action for their deportation with MEA which takes up the matter with Pak Embassy. The Counselor access is made. The Counselor from

Pak Embassy visits the jail for verifying whether they are really Pak citizens. Then Pak Embassy writes to MEA and action for repatriation is started.

- One of the Pak prisoners in jail is for the last 18 years because
 Pak embassy says that that person is not a Pak citizen.
- In many cases, Pak Govt. says that they are not their citizen even though all the details of the internees are made available to them.
- In the jail the Pak Internees are paid @Rs. 100/- per day. It was informed that in a PIL Punjab and Haryana High Court passed and order which can be summarized as under:

"The detenu will be sent back to Pakistan as soon as possible when the formalities regarding his return are complete. The detenu would be paid compensation of Rs.10,000/- per year or part thereof after his completion of sentence in lump-sum till the date of the disposal of the petition and a sum of Rs.100/- per day for every day thereafter till his repatriation.

- There are Bangaladeshi, Nigerian, Afghani, Chinese, African,
 Burmeese Myanmar and Afgani internees.
- With female prisoners, there are children also. Their elder daughters are in Nari Niketan, Jalandhar and son(s) in Juvenile home, Hoshiarpur.
- Among others, there are following three Pak female inmates who were arrested while going from Pak to Muzzaffar Nagar, U.P.:
 - Smt. Fatima Bibi, W/o Sh. Safi-Ur-Rehman, Holder of Pakistan Passpost No. BD-3095941, R/o Nichi Abadi, Dhull Gujranwala, Pakistan. - In jail since 10-05-06, U/s 21, 22, 23 NDPS Act 1985 with Section 53 NDPS Act and Section 119 of Custom Act, 1962
 - o Ms Mumtaz, D/o Mohd. Sadiq Sheikh, Passpost No. Au-5463891, R/o Awwa Road, Mohsikend Wazirabad, Gujranwala, Pakistan. In jail since 10-5-06, U/s 21, 22, 23

- NDPS Act 1985 with Section 53 NDPS Act and Section 119 of Custom Act, 1962
- Ms. Nasreen Akhtar, W/o Shri Afzal MOhd., Passport No. AG-1343241, R/o DAV Hostel No. 1 Court Street, Lower Mall, Lahore, Pakistan, In jail since 10-05-06, U/s 21, 22, 23 NDPS Act 1985 with Section 53 NDPS Act and Section 119 of Custom Act, 1962
- 250 gms. of dal and chappatis are given to inmates.
- The applications for pre-mature release sometimes take 4-5 years because of which pre-mature release gets delayed.
- The jail has two hospitals one indoor (inside the jail) hospital and another outdoor hospital. There are 12 patients in indoor hospital.
- There are 40 beds in both indoor and outdoor hospitals.
- In OPD around 200 patients are checked up daily. At present, 4 serious patients have been sent to district civil hospital. 4 patients are suffering from TB and 4 patients are suffering from HIV positive.
- OPD starts from 9 a.m. till 12 noon. All the required medicines are made available to patients. On medicines, around Rs. 1 crore is spent.



- Conduct regular checking of Fair Price Shops through Field Staff of the Deptt. to monitor the proper supply of ration to beneficiaries. For this purpose vigilance committees have also been formed by giving due representation to SCs & Panchayat members for keeping an eye on fair distribution of ration.
- Any complaint received regarding adulteration is referred to Chief Medical Officer for necessary action.



Hospital's Profile Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur

Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur is a district level hospital with sanction & functional bed capacity of 200. This hospital came into existence on 14/02/1959 with 50 beds capacity & was later upgraded to 100 in year 1972-73. Further in 1985, it was upgraded into 200 beds capacity. Thereafter Emergency & trauma ward were added to the hospital complex on 30/09/1997. After the establishment of Punjab Health Systems Corporation (PHSC), two new wings were added to this institution, which constitute diagnostic wing, operation theatre complex on 24/11/2001 & Computerization wing. Computerization in Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur was started on 11 may 2002 under HMIS (Health Management Information System). Under Computerization, different modules like OPD,IPD & DCM are running on five windows. This hospital has got 35 medical officers of different specialties including six Emergency Medical Officers as given below:

In surgery, this hospital has facility of laproscopic surgery & lately TUR unit has been added. In ortho department, facilities of C-ARM is available. Blood Bank is having all latest infrastructure & blood component separator unit. This hospital attended a blood donation camp at Ganganagar, Rajasthan through Shri Gurusar, Sacha Sauda & we have collected 117 units in camp. This hospital is in A+ for the last four consecutive years & our achievement in all the specialties is above 100%. This hospital provides emergency services in case of mass accident in a most disciplined & professional manner & has received appreciation from the District Administration every time.
