Report IV

Visit to Central jail Agra, District Jail Agra and Mathura by Special Rapporteur of NHRC, Dr Vinod Aggarwal on 12,13 and 14 March, 2018

The visit to District Jail Mathura was conducted on 12th March 18. Visit to Central Jail, Agra was done on 13th March. The district jail Agra was visited on 14th March, 2018. The reports in standard format submitted by Jail authorities are enclosed with this report as Anexxure-1(the format of Jail report of Mathura District jail). As Annexure -2(format of Central jail, Agra) is enclosed. Annexure-3 is the format of District Jail Agra. Salient points which emerged out of the visit to the Jails are as follows:

- 1. The capacity of the district Jails are 1015 inmates for Agra jail and 554 for Mathura jail, but the number prisoners accommodated are 2626 at Agra and 1654 at Mathura respectively. Both of the district jails suffer from severe overcrowding and which is more than 2.5 to 3 times, the capacity inmates are staying in Jails which have resulted in-human conditions and at some stage fight between inmates for want of space and contagious illnesses may increase. In summer months because of hot weather, fights between inmates increase as reported by Jail authorities.
- 2. The fact of overcrowding is less evident in central Jail Agra as overcrowding is only 160 % only, it can house 1110 has about 1841 inmates.
- 3. Posts which have been created for management of Jails are very less. The number of warders are about less than 50 with about 100 positions at the district jails and almost 50% of posts are vacant. This fact is confirmed with the visit of both the jails. In central jail Agra against posts of 214 Head warders and warders only 93 positions are filled up which is about 43%. Against 143 warders only 74 are in place. In Agra district jail, against 88 posts of head warders and warders there are 60 in position. In Mathura Jail the Posts of Head warders and warders are 56 and 58 are in

- position. Thus there is acute shortage of warders about which Jail Superintendents showed helplessness. NHRC must raise the issue of filling the posts of warders on urgent basis.
- 4. The posts for doctors have not been created sufficiently.
 Although one post has been created and one more is there based on contract but a norm must be fixed by the NHRC.
 The hospital is ill equipped and number of beds are much lesser than the 5% of the capacity or actual strength of the jails.
- 5. In both the district jails, the industrial production is not being attempted. In Central jail a low level of production is being done. Only the posts like weaving and tailor master are created and filled up. The posts of power-loom mechanic, electric sewing machine mechanic, band master, hand-made paper expert, carpet designer, painting trainer, trainer of Masonry, Electric motor binding trainer, printing press trainer, pump mechanic, oil mill mechanic, tractor driver, agriculture supervisor, chair weave mechanic are the post which need creation in the central jail, As the raw materials could not being procured regularly because of the tender procedure, therefore most of the inmates of the jail are either without work or under worked. There is need of optimum utilization of training manpower and productivity of the inmates.
- 6. The daily allowance paid for the work done by inmates is too low. They are paid at rate of Rs 40, 30 and 25 only. These rates are prevalent from April 2011. These rates should have been revised earlier but are under revision. The rate should have been 112, 125 and 152 as given in many other states. That may be another reason for the even inmates not wanting to work.
- 7. There is no chapatti making machine in any of the jails and district jail Agra has arranged for dough making machine from donations. And a Roti making machine is also expected through donations in this jail. The exhaust fans and gas stoves are available and used. The kitchens at all the 3 places have low level of cleanliness and there are no fly

catchers and fly proof automatic door closures. No Chimney but sufficient exhaust fans have been installed. The norms of food are sufficient with enough variety but only thing is whether the norms are provided or not and there is no way to measure it except for the officers directly involved in day to day management as there are no procedures to measure the food quality and quantity.

- 8. The number of appeals pending in high courts are many from Agra district jail inmates. There are 308 such appeals. There are 71 under-trials who are in jail for more than 5 years with shortage of space the under-trials can't be segregated from convicted inmates. In Mathura District jail also in 1363 under-trials there are 41 who are incarcerated for more than 5 years. There is a case for taking up with courts for appeals of the convicted and under-trial prisoners are disposed in a way that they are closed at the earliest.
- 9 . There is a matter of great concern that there are many prisoners who are in jail because of want of arranging the sureties. This is against the norms and there cases be present before the concerned authorities for securing their release.
- 10. In the Central Jail, Agra the number of inmates in the jail beyond 30 years of imprisonment were many. The rules followed by various states are at variance and overcrowding in UP jails is also because of not having a policy of release after 14-20 years when the convicted inmate had good behaviour which is being allowed in Haryana, MP, Jharkhand and other states. This requires that some discussions are done with UP home department by the NHRC.
- 11. The use of video conferencing is only for production of witnesses but not for the later stages. The need of the hour is that the videoconferencing use is to be increased to reduce the need to take the inmates to the court campus which is time consuming and costly.

Final Recommendations

General

- A) The establishment of one Model jail, in Agra division in next 2-3 years, to increase the facility of parole or remission to such convicts who have shown good behaviour and that will reduce the expenditure on state exchequer as these model jails can have reduced infrastructure and jail personal to reduce the costs to Government per inmate.
- B) The capacity of Jails be augmented according to number of inmates and crowding to the extent of 2.5 times be reduced to almost zero level in next 2-3 years.
- C) The personal (jailors, warders, head warders) be increased as per the formula of 1 warder for 10 inmates in jails. The cadres of Medical doctors is also too small and need to be augmented to a bigger cadre who are trained in treatment of psychiatric illnesses. All doctors posted to the jails should have 3-6 months course with psychiatry department of a tertiary medical care centre.
- D) The posts of trainers for education and vocations be created along with post of social workers and psychologists to change the out -look of the inmates., both under-trials and convicted inmates.
- E) Increase the wages as per Supreme Court guidelines for the inmates and get enough work for all those who want to work. Among the under-trials.
- F) Involvement of NGOs for the welfare, education, vocational training of prisoners as done in some jails
- G) General policy and powers of remission and parole is the need of all the central jails and speeding the trial for the under-trials is also a requirement.

Recommendation For District Jail Mathura specifically

- a) To augment the capacity or shift the inmates as 3 times the capacity are the no of inmates or to build another nearby jail to accommodate large no of inmates as the building is 160 years old. There is space between Mathura cantt end and the the main boundary wall of the existing jail where 2 storey, 8 barracks of capacity of 60-60, along with new kitchen, hospital ward can be made. The proposal is pending with Home department.
- b) Automatic chapatti Maker for the Kitchen, along with the chimney, automatic door closures in the kitchen. The Kitchen enclosure requires new construction with modern facilities. Estimate is pending at the state Jail Headquarters.
- c) The additional personal as suggested in the general recommendations for all jails in point C and D..
- d) Arrange release of such inmates who are not able to arrange for sureties themselves.
- e) Creation for facilities for production, so that the inmates are gainfully employed.
- f) The district of Mathura has border with Haryana, Rajasthan and nearby Delhi. Here about 160 under-trials are such whose production cannot be done on video-conferencing and they need to be physically produced for which guards are not made available most the time by the police and their cases are languishing for many years.
- g) There are at present 8 such under trial inmates whose case have ended in Mathura district for more than a month but there is non availability of police force to shift them to other districts of Up or state of Haryana, Delhi or Rajasthan. The letter written by Jail Supt. To District SP is enclosed
- h) Vice president of UP Jails association Shri Bharat Singh, along with other warders met me and gave a petition which is enclosed in original, in which they have demanded certain facilities which include increase in the no personals so that they have a certain no of inmates under charge of single warder. Many times 250-400 inmates are under control of

single warder. This is a valid demand and should be met in a reasonable time by the State government.

Recommendations for Central jail Agra.

ς,

- i) There is only one central jail in the western part of the state and the life term convicts from far of districts are kept here. The inmates from far of places crave for family members.
- ii) At present there is under staffing in this jail. Against 260 posts only 123 are in position. Although creation of posts of warders seems to be sufficient like for capacity of 1100 there are 33 head warders and 181 warders which sufficient by even BPRD norms but because of large no of vacancies and about 60% more inmates there seems to be more load but much better than district Jails of Agra and Mathura, but still it need to be improved. But the posts of trainers need to be increased and the productivity of the jail lot need to be done.
- materials have not been procured in time by the concerned authorities. This is a matter of great concern. There is need of coordination with various government department for procurement of various items of use by them from jail, like bed sheets, blankets, utensils, soap, and clothing for hospitals; files, printing, carpets, handmade papers for District Magistrate's office, Police and Judicial offices and almost all products for jail inmates can keep them gainfully employed and can look after their own families with this production.
- iv) The inmates are paid only 25, 30 and 40 Rs. Only which is much lesser than the BPRD norms. The other states are also paying much more than these rates. These rates need to be revised.
- v) This jail is comparatively new, only 35 years old and can be upgraded to more inmates can be kept by increasing the buildings. There are 1303 appeals of convicted

inmates since long from 3-30 years. There could be special attention on such life convicts whose appeals are pending for more than 20 years and if they are disposed of faster it will be in benefit of the inmates.

- vi) The kitchen of this jail also needs up gradation. It has no automation in the form of no kneaders or roti making machines. There are no automatic door closures, no chimneys, no steel utensils. These up-gradations are the need of the hour.
- vii) The services provided by the local tertiary care centre(Agra Medical Collage) need to be examined as it came to information that the Medical college at Agra almost forwards almost all the cases to higher centres, like SGPGI at Lucknow or AIIMS Delhi. This habit is because the Doctors at the medical college don't want to work and take risk and it came that some patients have come back 3-4 times without treatment.

There are 1808 life convicts in this jail and at-least 450 are more who have completed 20 years of imprisonment. The system of SSRB in the state is not transparent and opaque. It is required that NHRC sit with Jail and or home department and find a solution as there is lot recrimination for selective release which are very few and far between. It is again need of hour that the release of convicted prisoners is done on a laid down principle in a transparent manner in the whole state.

Recommendation for District Jail Agra specifically

i) To augment the capacity of the jail as 2.5 times the capacity are the no of inmates or to build another nearby jail to accommodate large no of inmates as the building is 180 years old. This jail was constructed as Building where Haj pilgrims were kept before they were sent further to Saudi Arabia. Although building is old but well maintained and well

- converted in Jail but when no record available, when it was converted to the jail. If that many under-trials are going to be kept than additional buildings may be constructed.
- j) Automatic chapatti Maker for the Kitchen is being procured by the jail suptd. through donations but along with the chimney, automatic door closures in the kitchen are also required.
- k) The additional personal as suggested in the general recommendations for all jails in point C and D.
- l) Arrange release of such inmates who are not able to arrange for sureties themselves.
- m) There are 71 such under-trials who are in jail for more than 5 years but their cases have not been decided by the courts. It is desirable that NHRC takes up there matter with the visitors.
- n) There is history of escape from while with the escorts and 2 cases of suicide in the jail in last 3 years. It seems that it is required that sufficient Social workers and Psychologists are provided to keep a watch on the under-trials so that such indents are reduced. There are some jail wards where concrete roof is not there. It would be an urgent requirement to convert the roof into a RCC one.
- o) There are at present many such under trial inmates whose case have ended in Agra district for few months but there is non availability of police force(escorts) to shift them to other districts of Up or state of Haryana, Delhi or Rajasthan.
- p) Many of prisoners continue in the jail for want of not able to pay the fine money which is some times in few thousand rupees. The Jail suptd., with the help of NGOs are secured release of about 100 prisoners with the help of lions club, rotary club and other NGOs by arranging few lakhs of funds. It is desirable that Govt. may create a fund at the hands of Divisional commissioner for release such gratuity for release of prisoners who are not able to pay fine of few hundreds or thousands and continue in prison, because of their poverty.
