3. The Terms of Reference of the constituted Core Group on Trafficking, Women and Children are as under:

- (i) Advise the Commission on issues relating to trafficking, women and children in India. These issues may include both references made by the Commission to the Core Group and any other issues, which the Members of the Core Group consider it appropriate to suggest to the Commission in the light of the relevant provisions of the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993.
- (ii) Review the existing government policies, laws/rules/orders, etc., relating to trafficking, women and children from the perspective of human rights and make suggestions for changes or their better implementation.
- (iii) Identify gaps in the policy framework and suggest measures to fill the same.
- (iv) Identify best practices on addressing the problem of trafficking and issues concerning women and children in India and abroad and recommend their replication.
- (v) Any other issue which is considered relevant to the subject by the Core Group.
- 4. The Core Group will meet periodically at regular intervals or as and when deemed necessary, in the Commission, at the convenience of the Members.
- 5. The participating Members of the Core Group stationed in Delhi shall be entitled to taxi fare and those stationed outside Delhi shall be entitled to TA (economy class air fare plus local taxi fare) for the journey undertaken by them in connection with the Core Group meetings.
