Sub: Visit Report of Dr. K. R. Shyamsundar, Special Rapporteur, NHRC to Child Welfare Homes in Kanyakumari District of Tamil Nadu from 5-7 September 2013

Dr. K. R. Shyamsundar, Special Rapporteur, NHRC visited Child Welfare Homes in Kanyakumari District of Tamil Nadu from 5-7 September 2013. The visit report of Special Rapporteur is placed at **Annexure-I.**

The observations made by the Special Rapporteur during his visit to Child Welfare Homes are summarized below:

1. Out of 107 Child Welfare Homes, 40 were registered and 65 Child Welfare Homes were being run without registration, though an application for registration had been made by them. However, 2 Homes were being run without even applying for registration.
2. Special parties comprising Zonal Officers/ Assistant Directors of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Department had been formed by the District Collector to find out whether all the Child welfare Homes were recognized or not and whether they have adequate infrastructural and other facilities.
3. Out of 40 registered Homes, 9 were found without basic infrastructural facilities; 13 with adequate building but without other infrastructural facilities and only 18 were found with adequate buildings and other facilities.
4. Of the 65 Homes applied for registration, 16 were found without basic facilities; 33 with adequate building but without other infrastructural facilities and only 16 were found with adequate building and other infrastructural facilities.
5. The District Authorities have recommended action against 9 registered Children Homes for want of all basic infrastructural facilities under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of children) Act, 2000 and also recommended cancelled of 16 Homes that applied for registration for want of adequate and reasonable infrastructural facilities.
6. Discreet inquiry reveals that both parents of quite large number of children are not only working but also reside within one/two kms from the Homes.
7. It is really surprising to see huge number of Child welfare Homes in Kanyakumari district which is a very small district of Tamil Nadu. Inquiry reveals that such Homes

are being used to prop up the strength of some school for getting Government grants. Quite a large number of children do have both employed parents.

8. It is reported that the total amount spent by NGOs for children is insufficient (just Rs. 750/child) when compared to the receipts in cash and kind. Though the organizers who run the Homes state that a huge amount is spent for teachers but interaction with teachers reveals otherwise. Besides, vast majority of NGOs are reluctant to place their funds for auditing.
9. A huge number of Child Welfare Homes not only in Kanyakumari District but throughout the State thrive due to collusion among irresponsible parents, selfish school authorities and vested interest of majority of NGOs who run the Homes for their living and not for charity/child welfare.

The recommendations made by the Special Rapporteur during his visit to Child Welfare Homes are summarized below:

1. It is recommended that surprise checks should be conducted frequently to prevent misuse and abuse of children and a detailed enquiry needs to be instituted regarding the aid received by such Homes from within and from abroad.
2. Parents also are required to be counselled by Samaritans to create awareness on various issues including ethics, values and morality.
3. It is recommended that all Homes who have not applied for registration should be immediately stopped.
4. Children too need to be educated to create awareness about 'child abuse'. In addition, Constant vigil is required to prevent misuses and abuse of children.

The matter is placed before the Full Commission for consideration and directions please.

On 7th September, 2013, I heard the grievances of the public at Nagercoil, District Head Quarter of Kanyakumari District from 1030 hours to 1345 hours. 37 petitions were presented and of which 6 were against District Administration; 7 against the police; 9 against Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation, Tirunelveli; 2 against local bodies and the rest general in nature.

2) A note on Child Welfare Homes in T.N. and in particular reference to Kanyakumari District and a four page note along with 37 petitions are sent for necessary action at your end please.

**Child Welfare Homes In Tamil Nadu and in particular reference to
Kanyakumari District**

(by Dr K.R.Shyamsundar, Special Rapporteur, NHRC SZ – I,)

On 6th September, 2013, after interacting with District Officials, I paid a visit to Child Welfare Home at Vellamadam. It has been started in the year 1988 by Director Smt. Rosamma, who was a spinster and a teacher for the love of the orphans. The school venue was given by Walk Board. It is maintained neat and tidy.

2.1) In the afternoon, one of the issues discussed with Collector Shri. S. Nagarajan among others was regarding Children Welfare Homes as their numbers in Kanyakumari District, which is a very small, was found to be very large.

2.2) Shri. S. Nagarajan has informed that he was serving in the district for a year and a half and that as per the instructions of the Government to find out whether all the Child Welfare Homes were recognized or not and whether they have adequate infra structure and other facilities, he formed special parties comprising Zonal Officers / Assistant Directors of Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Department for verification.

3) ~~Surprise Inspection of Child Welfare Homes~~ in Kanyakumari District has revealed the following:

- That of the 107 Child Welfare Homes, while 40 including 2 under Social Welfare Homes were registered, 65 applied for registration but running Homes and 2 were found running Homes even without applying for registration.
- That of the 40 registered Homes, 9 are found without basic infrastructural facilities; 13 with adequate building but without other infrastructural facilities and only 45% of the Homes i.e. 18 are found with adequate buildings and other infrastructural facilities
- That of the 65 Homes applied for Registration, 16 are found without basic infrastructural facilities; 33 with adequate building but without other infrastructural facilities and only 25% of the Homes i.e. 16 were found with adequate buildings and other infrastructural facilities
- That two Homes – Deborah Girls Home***, Kottilpadu and CSI Girls Home***, Mathiyodu did not even apply for registration
- That Collector recommended action against 9* registered Children Homes for want of all basic infrastructural facilities under Juvenile Justice Act, 2000 and also recommended cancellation of 16** that applied for registration for want of adequate and reasonable infrastructural facilities.
- Discreet inquiry reveals that both fathers and mothers of quite a large number of children are not only working and but also reside within one or two kms from the Homes!



5) **Recommendation** It is indeed a surprise rather a shock to see such a huge number of Child Welfare Homes in Kanyakumari district, which is a very small District in Tamil Nadu. Inquiry reveals that such Homes are being used to prop up the strength of some schools for getting Government grants. Moreover, quite a large number of children do have both parents that too employed. Further, it is reported that the total amount spent by NGOs for children is meager (just Rs. 750 / child) when compared to the receipts in cash and kind. Though the organizers who run the Homes state that a huge amount is spent for teachers, interaction with the teachers reveals otherwise. In addition, it is reported that a vast majority of the NGO is reluctant to place their funds for auditing, which itself is an indication that all is not well. A huge number of Child Welfare Homes not only in

Kanyakumari District but throughout T.N thrive due to collusion among irresponsible parents, selfish school authorities and vested interestedness of majority of NGOs who run Child Welfare Homes for their living and not for charity. Due to the foregoing, it is recommended that not only surprise checks should be conducted ~~to find out empty~~ hostels but also detailed inquiry to be instituted regarding the aid received by such Homes from within and from abroad. Parents also are required to be counseled by Samaritans to create awareness on various issues including ethics, values and morality. It is strongly recommended that all those Homes that have not applied at all deserve to be cancelled forthwith. Children are also required to be educated to create awareness regarding 'child abuse.' Constant vigil is required to prevent use, misuse and abuse of children.
